After Mrs. David's death a few years ago, her daughter-in-law, Ingrid, managed the store, while her son, Raymond, who had assisted for many years, ran it.

Finally, last year, time had come to close it. With it, has gone something valuable to Victoria Beach.

Victoria Beach Golf Course

The new hole, #5, 270 yards, Par 4, at the Victoria Beach Golf Course this year, 1991, is a nice improvement and brings to mind the other major changes to this lovely course in 1929.

The course was opened in 1923 and Par was 34. The short hole, 120 yards, was the second hole, and as this caused quite a back up, after playing the first, a new hole was constructed in the bush, which became the third hole, 140 yards, and the third hole, 216 yards, became the second hole, 265 yards, and Par for the course was set at 32 in 1929. All the holes were re-measured in 1975, and Par for the course was changed from 32 to 29. The new Par in 1991, is 30.

The present Clubhouse was built in 1976-77, replacing the old log building.

Mr. Frank E. Sprague, General Manager of The Victoria Beach Company, designed the golf course and was a major player in starting construction of the golf course in the early twenties. Steve Boulthier, was Mr. Sprague's right hand man and worked hard on the fairways and greens for several years. Steve and his wife looked after the clubhouse and lived there.

A number of people have been Managers, professionals, or in charge of the clubhouse and we list a few here. Mr. A.F. Caldwell, Steve Drew, Brent Potts, Tiny Lees, Stan Blunderfield, Mr. Forbes, Harry Spinks, Florence Eaton, Lloyd and Zel Smith, Dave Dawes (Shirley and Pam) and John Evans. Trevor Priestly, is our grounds keeper and the new assistant in the clubhouse is Paulette.

In checking through some old Victoria Beach Herald's (courtesy of Doris Pascoe), we note the green fees in the twenties and thirties were as follows: Adult 9 holes, .25¢, 18 holes, .40¢, book of 20 tickets, \$4.50, Children 9 holes, .15¢, 18 holes, 30¢

We also note by 1959, Adult fees were .75¢ for 9 holes, and .50¢ for the second nine. Children, 16 years and under, .25¢ for 9 holes. Hard to believe today!

Our thanks to the Municipality and John Evans, for the new fifth hole, and we hope a practice putting green will be built in the near future.

Aunt Vickie's Cookery Column

In keeping with the dual themes this year of what to serve when guests have arrived and there's nothing to serve and what is easy, here are two more favorites.

MOM'S TUNA CASEROLLE

1 1/2 c. raw rice
1 1/2 c. water
1/2 tsp. salt
1 can of cream soup any flavour (mushroom, chicken, celery)
1/2 c. frozen peas, sauteed mushrooms or green peppers or anything else you have around

In a pot cook rice in salted water until soft and ready. (Add a little extra water if necessary) Put in a casserole dish. Add onion, tuna, soup and vegetables. Mix. Bake at 350° for 15 min. or until heated through.

FEED THE STARVING MASSES

3 tbsps. margarine or oil
3 tbsps. flour
1 can tuna
1 1/2 c. milk
1/4 tsp. salt
1 small onion chopped
any sauteed or chopped cooked vegetable you have (optional)

Make a white sauce using the oil, flour, milk and salt. Added vegetables and tuna. Serve on toasted french bread. You really can feed millions with this simple lunch idea.

If you hate tuna, use flakes of turkey or flakes of chicken in either of these recipes.

WE ARE SURVIVORS!!!! Consider the changes that we have witnessed: We were born before television, before penicillin, before polio shots, frozen foods, Xerox, plastic, contact lenses, Frisbees and the PILL.

You could buy a new Chevy Coupe for \$600.00, but who could afford one? A pity, too, because gas was 11¢ a gallon.

In our day, cigarette smoking was fashionable, Grass was mowed, Coke was a soft drink and Pot was something you cooked in. Rock Music was a Grandma's lullaby and Aids were helpers in the Principal's Office.

We were certainly not before the difference between the sexes was discovered, but we were surely before the sex change — we made do with what we had. And we were the last generation that was so dumb as to think you needed a husband to have a baby! No wonder we are so confused and there is such a generation gap today!

BUT, WE SURVIVED!!! What better reason to celebrate?
