Council Corner

In late June the municipality was informed that the provincial government is proposing an amendment to the Municipal Act which would limit the running for council in the municipality from those who are residents in the municipality for two months of the year to those who are resident for two "consecutive" months. This would, of course, severely restrict the number of people who could run for the council.

The committee hearings to study the amendment were held on July 9, 1991. Noel Pritchard, one of our councillors did attend the meeting, but really there has not been consultation with our municipality regarding the change. Please take the time to write or call your MLA, Darren Prasnikiu the MLA for this region or Jim Downey the minister in charge and express your concern.

The most common complaint heard by councillors of Victoria Beach is with regard to dogs. If the owners of dogs do not keep their pets off the beach in the daytime and do not take steps to clean up after their pets, the council will have to enact a stronger bylaw and employ more people to enforce such a bylaw.

Complaints have been received about the residents leaving Sunday night and putting their garbage on the front street. This means that the garbage cans may stay on the front street until the next weekend. The garbage contractor will go into your yard to empty the cans, so please don't put them out front if you are not going to be there to return the garbage cans to the yard.

There also have been several complaints about bicycle riders not being careful and slowing down at the corners, and not warning the pedestrians that they are coming. While bells and horns would help, a simple greeting of "coming through", or "I'm on your right" would do the job. Be thoughtful.

White Bike Project

Last week thirty white bikes arrived down at the lake. Earth Corp dropped off the bikes for us to use. The thought was that the weekend house guest, the visiting friend, the cottage renter would be able to use the bikes to get around.



Aunt Vickie's Cookery Column

My mom made this cake at least once a week while I was growing up. It lasted about 6 hours in our house.

HOT MILK SPONGE CAKE:

2 eggs, separated	1 tsp. baking powder
3/4 c. white sugar	1/2 tsp. salt
1 tsp. vanilla	1/2 c. milk
1 c. sifted flour	1 tsp. margarine or butter

Separate eggs; stiffly beat whites; beat yolks until thick and lemon colored. Fold whites into yolks. Gradually add sugar and vanilla. Beat until sugar is dissolved. Combine dry ingredients and fold into egg mixture. Heat milk and margarine or butter to boiling; fold into cake batter. Pour into ungreased 8 x 8 pan. Bake at 300°F for 45-50 minutes. Cool and ice with a basic white butter icing.

I tried this last week on one of those rainy days.

BANAN CAKE

1/3 c. margarine or shortening	1 1/2 c. flour
3/4 c. brown sugar	1 tsp. baking powder
3/4 tsp. vanilla	1/3 tsp. salt
1 egg, well beaten	1/2 tsp. baking soda
2 overripe, mashed bananas	1/2 c. sour milk

(To make milk sour, add 1 tsp. of vinegar to 1/2 c. milk and let sit for 3 or 4 minutes.) Cream margarine, sugar and vanilla. Beat until light. Add egg and mashed bananas. Add sifted dry ingredients alternately with sour milk. Beat quickly and lightly until smooth. Pour into greased 8 x 8 pan. Bake at 375°F for 30 to 35 minutes.
