

Tucker Inn - Tuckered Out

In March of this year Mrs. Mary Tucker, long time cottager at Victoria Beach, passed away at the age of 95 in Agincourt, Ontario.

About 70 years ago, Mrs. Tucker with her husband Major Park Tucker vacationed in one of the Donalds cottages near the Pinhurst Inn. In subsequent years, she rented the Holland cottage on Fifth Avenue and the Hemmen cottage (now Wise-Clend) on Sixth Avenue.

In 1950 Albert Larson, well-known builder at the beach, built a cottage for Mrs. Tucker at 206-Sixth Avenue. Her good friends Hope Burnham and Moss MacWhirter, and previous owners, had lost their cottage in a fire. Ten years later Mrs. Tucker's second cottage was erected by Mr. Larson at 216 Sixth Avenue. Her foresight and courage which motivated her to have the cottages built continue to bring pleasure to her family and friends.

Mrs. Tucker paid her last visit to the beach in 1990. 



Aunt Vickie's Cookery Column

MARINATED VEGETABLES

An easy idea for salad - This will keep in the fridge for a week or more.

Prepare a Tangy French Dressing

- 1/2 cup salad oil (I sometimes cut this back to 1/3 cup)
- 1/2 cup vinegar or lemon juice
- 1/2 cup water
- 2 tsp. sugar
- 1 tsp. paprika
- 2 tsp. Worcestershire sauce
- 1/2 tsp. salt
- 1/2 tsp. celery salt
- 1/4 tsp. dry mustard
- 1/4 tsp. pepper
- Dash of cayenne or tabasco.
- Mix together.

In a large bowl or extra large pickle jar arrange:

- 1 cup broccoli cut into bite size pieces
- 1 cup cauliflower florets
- 1 cup of carrot slices
- 1 cup of celery slices
- 1/2 cup of small onions sliced into rings
- 1/4 cup of radishes

Pour dressing over vegetables and place in the fridge for at least six hours.

To serve in smaller amounts, scoop out the amount required and place in a smaller bowl.

Green pepper slices and mushrooms and many other vegetables that do not keep as well can be added to the smaller bowl just prior to serving.

New vegetables can be added to the marinade mix for at least a week.

TANGY SPINACH TOSS

- 1/4 cup butter or margarine
- 2 tbsp. sliced green onions
- 2 tbsp. flour
- 1/4 tsp. salt
- 1 cup water
- 2 tbsp. lemon juice
- 1 tsp. horseradish
- 1/2 tsp. Worcestershire sauce
- 3 hard cooked eggs
- 1 lb. fresh spinach, torn into bite-size pieces

Cook onions in butter about 1 minute; blend in flour and salt. Add water, lemon juice, horseradish, and Worcestershire; cook and stir until mixture boils. Dice one egg; add to dressing. Pour dressing over spinach in salad bowl; toss lightly. Slice remaining eggs for garnish; sprinkle with paprika; serve at once.

Makes 6 to 8 servings.
