Cross Country Run

Beach Delivery of the Free Press

The **Winnipeg Free Press** is offered by home delivery throughout the main cottage area. Over the past years the cost of the paper has created confusion for cottage owners. Most of the confusion results from the **Free Press** printing a "Rural" weekly home delivery price of \$3.00 on the front page of the paper. This rate does not apply to the beaches.

The summer delivery price is set by the **Free Press** at the daily newsstand price and not the rural price. The weekly summer delivery price is \$4.58 which is 6 papers at 54 cents, plus the Saturday paper at \$1.34, all prices including G.S.T.

Last year the weekly summer delivery price was \$3.56. The **Free Press** raised the daily newsstand price this past May, which has resulted in the increase. Unfortunately, a few cottagers seem to have felt that the paper boys and girls are overcharging and have been rather abusive. It is not the paper deliverer who sets the price. Please remember, when your paper comes to your cottage, rain or shine, the cost has been set by the **Free Press**.

Victoria Beach Cemetery

"Nestled in the rolling slope of a hill, just a short walk from the lake shore, is the resting place of many from Victoria Beach. It was the corner acre of Jim Olafson's section" (From the *Beaches to the Falls*). Jim Olafson who had been born aboard ship enroute to Canada from Iceland in 1884 settled in Victoria Beach in 1911. In 1906 he had married Frances (Fanny) Hampton, daughter of Hank and Annie Hampton who had settled at Victoria Beach in 1898. When Fanny died, Jim set about making arrangements with the municipality to have his corner acre deeded as a cemetery and in June 1931, Fanny was buried there.

In the past few years, Bert Trainor and others in charge of the cemetery, Oscar Olafson, John Ateah, Leonard David, Harold Martin, Bruce Anderson, Marina Chapel, could see there was a need for a larger cemetery in Victoria Beach. The present one acre was becoming reserved by the old families, and in order to accommodate the many new "permanent residents" and cottage owners who showed interest in being buried here near the cottage where the whole family could continue to get together each summer, a new acre to the west has been donated by the R.M. of V.B.

A much needed chain link fence with a large and small gate is being installed this summer by Lysall Trainor (Lysall's Landscaping). The cost is high, but the job must be done. St. Michael's Church is seeking tax deductible donations towards the fence of \$10.00 per foot. Make cheques payable to St. Michael's Church Fence Fund and leave in the collection plate or give them to John Ateah, Walter Whyte, Helen Trainor or Jim Muir. A list of donors will be put in the church history and put in the cemetery under a roof.

Anyone interested in buying a plot in the new acre may contact Helen Trainor at 756-2257 or 756-2466. Plots are \$200.00 or two urn burials in one plot are \$200.00 per burial.

Aunt Vickie's Cookery Column**CHICKEN SPAGHETTI**

Oven 350 30 - 40 minutes

- 1 lb. spaghetti
- 1 small onion minced
- 2 tbs. butter or margarine
- 4 pimentos chopped
- 1 cup green pepper, chopped
- 1 chicken cooked and chopped
- Cook chicken and cool. Reserve a cup of chicken stock for Frontier sauce. Cook spaghetti. Mix ingredients.

SAUCE

- 1 4 oz. can mushrooms
- 3 1/2 cup canned tomatoes
- 1/4 tsp. black pepper
- 1 1/2 cups Longhorn cheese, grated
- Mix sauce. Toss with spaghetti mixture.

FRONTIER SAUCE

- 6 tbs. flour
- 4 tbs. butter
- 1 tsp. salt
- 1 tsp. paprika
- dash Tabasco sauce
- 1 1/2 cup tomato juice
- 1 cup chicken stock
- 4 tbs. heavy cream

Melt butter, add flour, salt and paprika. Add liquids and heat until thickened. Pour over spaghetti mixture and bake in 350 degree oven for 30 - 40 minutes. Top with sliced black olives and serve.

Safe Not Sorry - Children and Animals

The Canadian Institute of Child Health published the following item as a guide for parents in teaching their children how to interact safely with animals. Perhaps it bears repeating.

Bites from pets and other animals are common. Children are most vulnerable and often the victims of these injuries. Bites can cause death or significant injuries such as facial disfigurement, loss of sight and other serious physical or psychological problems. A thorough understanding of animals behaviour and respect for animals will help to prevent bites.

1. Teach children to avoid all strange animals, especially wild, sick or injured ones.
2. Notify the health department or police of any wild, sick or injured animals.
3. Never permit children to break up an animal fight, even if their own pet is involved.
4. Be aware and make children aware of the danger of mistreating or teasing pets. They are not toys and will bite if mauled, annoyed or frightened. Never pull an animal's tail or take away food, a bone or a toy that the animal is playing with.
5. Tell children to avoid riding bicycles or tricycles on routes where dogs are known to chase vehicles.
6. Never disturb an animal that is eating or sleeping. Set a good example by your own behavior.
7. Have children make friends with pets in their immediate neighborhood under adult supervision.
8. Do not purchase or obtain a pet for children until they demonstrate enough maturity and ability to care for it. This ability is unusual in children under six years of age.
9. Never hold your face, or allow a child to hold his or her face, close to an animal.
10. Do not permit a child to lead a large dog.
11. Do not run, ride a bicycle or skate in front of a dog. It will be startled.
12. Do not overexcite an animal, even in play.
13. Do not keep an animal confined with a short rope or chain. This may make it aggressive and vicious, especially if teased.
14. Tell children to avoid a dog raised in a home without children, as such a dog may resent children.
15. Do not allow inexperienced children to feed a dog. They may pull back when the animal moves to take the food, and the dog may become frightened. This practice is potentially dangerous.
16. Teach children, when approaching a pet, to stop, stand still and speak softly. Never reach your hand out towards a dog. Allow the dog to make the first overtures of friendship with you, letting the dog sniff you first.

In many areas of Canada rabies is still an important consideration, so do not let your pet come into indiscriminate contact with other animals. Be sure that your pet is vaccinated every year and examined regularly by a veterinarian.

SHRIMP AND PASTA SALAD

5 cups cooked small pasta shells
2 cups cooked shrimp
1 1/2 cups finely diced cheese
1 cup diced dill pickles
1 cup cooked peas
1/2 cup finely chopped green onions
1 - 1 1/4 cups salad dressing
1/4 cup French dressing
1 tsp. dill weed
1 tsp. lemon juice
salt and pepper to taste
