

Hard Times

Hard times today you say? You might feel better if you knew about how difficult times were during the great depression for Thor and Lena Halgren. They can readily recollect the hardships of their first years on Little Elk Island (Victoria Beach), Manitoba, where today, from their small but comfortable home, they will be celebrating 50 years of marriage with an open house on August 8th.

Thor was born in Sweden in 1907 and came to Canada at the age of 19 in 1926. After working in eastern Canada, he came west as a farm laborer. In 1927 he moved to Fort Francis to work in a lumber camp until the depression made work even scarcer. This was when he began fishing on Lake Winnipeg. His homestead was one room of log and sod with a stone fireplace and hand made furniture.

Thor fished off of Elk Island for a living in those tough years. Through the heat of summer and the cold of winter, what he caught he either ate or sold. "Winters were unusual when you didn't run out of firewood trying to fight the subzero cold." Fish were trekked across the lake into Gimli where jobbers purchased the frozen pickerel and whitefish for resale into Winnipeg and Chicago. Often these treks across the ice were in the punishing cold but they were the only outings the fishermen and their families had to look forward to and they were a chance for social contact.

In 1942 after several years of fishing and living alone, Thor Halgren met and married his wife Lena. Thor and Lena had two children, Thor Jr., and Glen. Both boys worked with their parents in the fishing industry and well knew the hardships of their parents' occupation.

Today there are still many of these hard people who fish in the -30 C weather for their livelihood. Thor has not fished for some years now and Lena's life is easier too. Not too far from where they pulled their nets up, they think of those by-gone years, tough, but full of love and friendships, as they enjoy their golden years. The memories remain of when a poor catch meant the difference between survival and starvation. The dangers, the cold, the good years and the friendships made are still there and so is the knowledge that they endured and survived these difficult times and that they had won!



HOT CRAB AND HAM SPREAD (Linda Jeffrey)

2 x 8 oz. pkg. cream cheese
1 cup mayonnaise
1 tin flakes of ham
1 tin crab meat
1 cup grated cheddar cheese
2 tsp. dill
3 or 4 chopped green onions
Mix together.

2 tbsp. sugar
1 cup grated cheddar cheese
1/2 medium onion, finely chopped

All you need is a fork and a bowl. Combine all ingredients except for beer, until they are all mixed. Add beer a quarter at a time until all ingredients are blended. Put into a buttered, floured bread pan, smooth it down with your fork. Pop into a pre-heated 350 F oven. Bake for 1 hour and 10 minutes.

On the basis of their past performances, J. Adamson of Winnipeg and A. Black of Toronto and Salamina, Columbia were granted byes into next year's finals to be held on July 18th, 1993.

Council Corner

At the council meeting of July 21, requests were made for the noise bylaw regulations. The complete bylaw is available at the Victoria Beach Office. Following are some excerpts from the bylaw.

Clause 1.(1) No person shall make . . . any loud unnecessary or unusual noise or any noise which annoys, disturbs, injures or endangers the comfort, repose, health, peace or welfare of others . . . etc.

Clause 1.(2) No person shall permit . . . any loud noise as a consequence of any of the following acts . . . etc.

Clause 1(2)(b) The using, operating or permitting to be played, used or operated any radio receiving set, television, musical instrument, phonograph, loudspeaker, or other machine or device for the production or amplification of sound in such a manner as to annoy or disturb the peace, quiet, comfort, or repose of the neighboring inhabitants.

Clause 1(2)(f) The discharge into the open air of any stationary internal combustion engine, motor boat or other motor vehicle except through a muffler or other device which effectively prevents loud or explosive noises therefrom, or any noise which may annoy, disturb, injure or endanger the comfort . . . or welfare of other.

Clause 1(3) Doing any of the aforesaid acts between the hours of 11:00 p.m. of one day and 7:00 a.m. on the following day is prohibited.

Clause 4 Any person guilty shall be liable to a fine not exceeding \$200.00 . . . etc.

Brush Clearing - Brush piles are cleared away in June as soon as the cars are restricted. Residents are asked not to pile brush on the road allowances during July and August since it will not be removed until October. Please pile it on your own property until the end of August before moving it to the road allowance.

If professional or other tree cutters are employed, please arrange for them to haul the brush away.

Bicycles - Cyclists are requested to warn pedestrians of their presence behind them, by bells or other noises, and are requested to reduce speed when approaching pedestrians.

Speed Limits

Speed limits are posted on roads throughout the municipality, but up until now we have not really had any way of enforcing the limits and have had to rely on the voluntary compliance of drivers.

This is no longer true. During the month of July a series of tests using radar equipment has been conducted. At the July meeting, council approved the use of radar equipment to clock speeders. Tickets will now be issued. The limit on Highway 59 is 70 km and the limit on all smaller roads is 30 km or 20 km.

Drive with care and obey the law.
