

windows. All the men of the community came to help with the bigger jobs and with everyone working and giving together the job progressed quickly.

On August 16, 1952, a few months after the job was begun, the Church was dedicated. It was packed. No pews were installed yet, so everyone stood. The Most Rev. L.R. Sherman, Archbishop of Rupert's Land, assisted by Archdeacon N. Holmes and Rev. R. Dawson dedicated St. Michael's Church. It was a joyous day after hundreds of hours of volunteer labour.

After the Church was completed, Bill Martin placed the flags and the Roll of Honour of those who served in the two World Wars from our community (from Victoria Beach to Belair). He brought them from the Legion Hall, as he felt they were best left in the Church.

In the early days, the Church was heated with a wood burning stove, as there was no electricity in Victoria Beach in those days. Later, an oil burner was installed. When hydro was available, the Church was wired by Brodie Munro and John Ateah. (Brodie was a brother of Jessie Ateah and Daisy Monsen.) Finally, electric baseboard heating was installed in the church.

For the first 20 years, worship services were primarily provided by the Anglican Church. Rev. William Stenson of the United Church also held services and performed many marriages and funerals in the community. Sunday school was held each Sunday. Canon and Mrs. Fred Glover held a service in the Church each May 24th long weekend, which became a tradition over the years.

More recently, ministers from other denominations have come on a regular basis. The Roman Catholic congregation began using the Church around 1970, and in 1983 the Summer Community Church also began to worship at St. Michael's Church.

The Church has been updated in the past 10 years. An addition was built with plumbing installed. The younger generation gave generously. Dennis Danwich wired the addition free of charge and many donations of materials were received. Lloyd Jonsson was hired for the construction. All new improvements were organized and spearheaded by Helen and Bert Trainor. Improvements included new cedar finish outside, new ceiling and cedar finish inside, wall to wall carpeting, new windows, and cushions on the pews. Money was raised for the purchase of a piano, and when the piano was donated by the family of Canon and Mrs. Fred Glover, the money was used for a sound

system for the church.

Donations, both of time and gifts, have always played a large role in the life of the Church. Many of the items which are present in the Sanctuary are either memorial gifts or the fruit of diligent labour. The pulpit and the stained glass windows were built by Bert Martin, and the prayer desk and lectern were built by his brother Bill Martin. John Ateah built the bell tower to house a bell donated by Rev. Genevieve Murdock. John also built the stone pillars, the iron gates and put up the fencing at the front of the Victoria Beach Cemetery. Both the Sanctuary altar and the hymn board were donated by the Anglican Diocese. The baptismal font was donated by Elizabeth Horton and Mary Bonne. The antique chair at the front of the Church was donated by George and Lillian Lockhart. The Bible was a gift of Harry and Bertha Humphrey. The crocheted Lord's Prayer came from Mrs. Albert Larson. The candelabras were donated by Freda Jonsson. The light fixtures were donated by Albert and Lita Larson. The Ladies Auxiliary donated many articles, including the chandelier and the carpet runners. Our current organ was purchased with money donated in memory of Shafia Ateah.

It is this generous and loving spirit which had made St. Michael's Church the vibrant centre of community life which it is today. We owe a great debt of gratitude to our predecessors who, with great vision and determination, built a place of meditation and worship which so well meets our needs today. Let us take up the torch and join with them, ensuring that in 2052, there will be an equally vibrant and joyous celebration of St. Michael's one hundredth anniversary.
