


Lake Winnipeg Water Level Information

June 1993

The following information is provided by the Water Resources Branch, Province of Manitoba, and published by Manitoba Hydro as a courtesy to those interested in the outlook for water levels on the lake.

LAKE WINNIPEG REGULATION

The level of Lake Winnipeg is regulated by Manitoba Hydro by a control structure at Jenpeg on the Nelson River near the outlet of the lake. While the wind eliminated level of Lake Winnipeg is between the UPPER STORAGE LIMIT of 715.0 feet and the LOWER STORAGE LIMIT of 711.0 feet, Manitoba Hydro regulates the lake for hydroelectric purposes. During periods when the water level is above 715.0 feet, Manitoba Hydro must operate the control structure at Jenpeg in such a manner to effect maximum discharge possible under the circumstances then prevailing until the water level of Lake Winnipeg recedes to 715.0 feet. During periods when the water level is below 711.0 feet, Manitoba Hydro must operate the control structure at Jenpeg as ordered by the Minister of Natural Resources.



CURRENT CONDITIONS

The wind eliminated level of Lake Winnipeg is 713.7 feet and is rising slowly. Inflows to the lake are still below normal for this time of the year in spite of a return to normal rainfall over the Lake Winnipeg drainage basin during June.

LAKE WINNIPEG LEVEL FORECAST

The water level forecast above shows a range of future water levels on Lake Winnipeg for the next three months. The forecast shown "BEST ESTIMATE" will occur if present inflow trends continue. The remaining two forecasts show the range of possible levels given the extreme wet or dry conditions. The forecast shown "WET" will result if rainfall over the Lake Winnipeg drainage basin is well above normal. The forecast shown "DRY" will result if precipitation is much below normal and evaporation from the lake is high.

Our Neighbour the Elk *by Beaverbrook*

Victoria Beach aficionados harbour a long list of "best kept secrets". Amongst friends and fellow inhabitants, there is no point in hoarding these treasures save that they are given the general respect and appreciation they deserve. Why spoil an already good thing.

If you have ever cross-country skied here in the winter and scraped back the covering on the Lake, you'll see a deep bottle-green icecap a meter thick where once you swam. June is high on the list of favourable experiences. The beaches have just shed their thick winter carpets of ice and snow. The bright emerald green leaves seem translucent on the trees then. The birds are arriving, nesting and hold the highest head count of living settlers throughout the month.

Dozens of wild flowers bloom brilliantly in our gardens and along the paths. Some orchids erupted in the rough of the second fairway on the golf course this year which could have taken first prize at the Chelsea Flower Show in London. For the first three weeks of June this year, we had several 30 degree days, warm clear waters and practically the whole Beach to ourselves. Given July's opening downpour, we thought June was going to be the summer of '93.

With July, this fantasy evaporates and the Beaches turn into the yardstick communities. Every child measures themselves comparing spurts of growth with their friends from last summer. Missing teeth, length of hair, new toys, swimming and sailboard skills are rapidly compared. Eleven months of winter gossip is compressed with excitement into the weeks of summer. Getting up with the sun for a walk, round of golf, sail or a swim will restore the feeling of June when you have all the place to yourself.

For those who have ever wondered what that long thin pencil of land jutting above the Lake to the North was, here is our best kept secret. When the crowds of the Beach have exhausted you and adventure lurks in your blood, you can walk, sail or paddle over to Elk Island. Bigger than the whole landmass of Victoria Beach, it stretches four kilometres long by one and a half wide and is completely uninhabited. We are grateful for the provincial government running out of money immediately after declaring it a Heritage Park.

It has been for centuries one of the ornithological centres of the world. Hundreds of thousands of migrating species nest here in the spring. It can be credited with helping to save the whooping crane whose numbers sank below a dozen in the 1950's as half of the surviving species called Elk Island their home. Today, the Pelican has been taken off the endangered list but is still vulnerable. A familiar dozen guard the SE corner of the island now. Last week, we saw a nesting family of semi-

palmed plovers, still given priority protection by the WWF.

There are a couple of trails across the island, an old log cabin used by fishermen decades ago and the remains of a Bible camp long abandoned. Snowmobiles break the magical silence during winter. A few motorized vehicles find their way to the island during the critical nesting weeks of spring, disrupting events. Now power boats from Victoria Bay zoom across leaving their plastic drink containers and beer cans behind. Black flies remain the only natural defense system to protect the island.

Blueberries proliferate by the millions. Wildflowers lay a carpet of rainbow colours. It is the silence and wildness of the place that haunts the daytripper. Sailing around the southern point or walking overland, make your way to the northwest quadrant for a view of one of the most spectacular beaches in the world. Two kilometres long and 75 meters wide with a long sand bar extending out a further hundred yards, this beach would have a street value of \$1.6 billion dollars in Southern Florida. For those of us who share this little isthmus, it is our bolthole neighbour which we must preserve and protect in its wild, free and natural state.

 2. In 1992 the longest par 3 hole at the Golf Course was the 9th hole. In 1993 the hole was extended to measure 321 yards and was changed from a par 3 to a par 4. Therefore, the new longest par 3 hole on the course in 1993 is the 8th hole, which measures 203 yards.
 3. The Ateah children who first settled in Victoria Beach were Lily, Louise, Sophia Jr., Margaret, Pansy, Eddie, Sam, Alfred, John, Freda.
 4. The four streets in the Beach named after Queen Victoria's children include Arthur, Patricia, Alexandra and King Edward.
 5. In the court case, the Plaintiff (more accurately termed the Petitioner) challenged the Defendant (more accurately termed the Respondent) in one area of The Elections Act. Nutter contended Thain was ineligible to hold a position on council because he was not a resident of Victoria Beach for more than the minimum required 60 days a year. Ross Yarnell, acting on behalf of Thain, submitted evidence to substantiate Thain's claim of residence in Victoria Beach far in excess of the 60 required days a year. Thain won the case and continues to fulfill his elected duties on council of the Municipality of Victoria Beach.
 6. The initial price of a cab fare at the parking lot was 50¢. Considering inflation over the years, cab fares are lower priced now compared to the initially introduced rate.
 7. The picture on the front of the August 9, 1985 Herald is an aerial photo which shows the marina, lagoon, swamp, part of Highway 59 and many bays and streets in the Beach's area.
 8. The proprietors of the Store - Herb Harbhour; Moonlight Inn - Dan Sudermann and Barbara Sudermann; Bakery - Chuck Einfeld; and the person in charge of operations at the Golf Course - John Evans.
 9. There does exist a bomb shelter in Victoria Beach and it is located beside Pine Road. Rumour has it that there is tomato soup on the shelves of the shelter which date back to World War II. Amazing!
 10. The last proprietor of the Butcher Shop in Victoria Beach was James Kilpatrick.
