

ANSWERS to last week's questions:

- In 1967 the municipality purchased the Beach Company for \$72,000.00. Art Vincent was the previous owner.
- Victoria Beach's first permanent settlers were Henry and James Hampton. They arrived in 1880.
- In 1966 the Canadian Premiers visited the shores of Victoria Beach.
- The first bakery was constructed in 1922 as well as a new general store and a butcher shop.
- In 1921 the Victoria Beach Club was established because of the need for recreational facilities for the growing number of summer residents.
- In June of 1913, Letters Patent of Incorporation of the Victoria Beach Company Limited were granted to W. Bebest, physician; C.W.N. Kennedy, broker; C. Vokes, broker; F.C.N. Kennedy, registrar; and A.C. Miller, accountant. The Victoria Beach Investment Company was taken over by the Victoria Beach Company Limited. Stock value was set at \$3,000,000.00.
- In 1919 the Rural Municipality of Victoria Beach was formed and a council was elected. Charles W.N. Kennedy was voted in as the area's first Reeve.
- The old school teacher's cabin is located at 133 - 1st Ave. It is now owned by the Browns.
- Harvey Cramp Sr., Keith Black and John Sinclair were stranded for six hours in an Enterprise during a Lake Winnipeg squall with little or no sailing experience. After recovering from their ordeal, Keith Black and John Sinclair had T-shirts printed which said "I sailed with Harvey Cramp and lived".
- Jamie Dawson was the 1992 Canadian National Badminton champion.
