



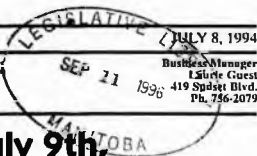

With any infraction of the Criminal Code, our Police notify the R.C.M.P. and work in conjunction with them. Our Police also enforce Municipal By-laws.

The Police powers are outlined in the Provincial Police Act and the Manitoba Municipal Act.

Keep in mind that our Police Officer was hired by Council as a Police Constable under a Municipal By-law, according to the Manitoba Municipal Act.

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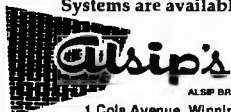
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Elk Island Resort

During the ice age regression of the Agassiz Glacier and long before Pierre de Laverendrye first stepped foot on "Isle aux Biches" in 1734, two islands were left in the trench which formed Lake Winnipeg. Various 18th century explorers divided the lake into two parts; Lake Bourbon (North Basin) and Lake Quinipique (South Basin). Later the Nor'West and Hudson Bay Company anglophiles translated the two islands into Big and Little Elk Island, separated by Indian Portage. With the rail link in 1916, Little Elk lost its island demarcation and became Victoria Beach. With fur trading posts springing up at Fort Maurepas and Fort Alexander, new settlers arriving at the Forks (the Swiss Watwil Regiment 1811, Selkirk Scots 1812, and Swiss des Meurons settlers 1816) Elk Island became a prominent navigation beacon, resting place and North America's first wilderness shopping mall. Fish, deer, blueberries, sand cherries, ducks and geese thrived in bounteous numbers when first discovered. After Laverendrye (1734 - 43) came Alexander Henry (1794) and Daniel Harmon (1800) who stocked the Northwest Company with winter food supplies, then Governor Miles MacDonnell (1812) and Thomas Douglas (Earl of Selkirk) (1816) with new settlers, and finally Viscount Field Marshall Garnet Wolseley (1870) to put down the Riel Rebellion. The first permanent European settlers (Hank Hampton and Jim Pautson) arrived in the 1890's, with the Hamptons living briefly on Elk Island to tend to fishing offshore. The plentiful harvests of pickeral, goldeye, whitefish, perch and sturgeon brought a fishing community together including Alec Anderson (1904) and the Ateahs (1911). Tamarack trees from Elk

Island provided settlers with sturdy log homes. A thriving fish and forest cottage community rapidly evolved into North America's only car-less community with the arrival of the steam train in 1916.

Defined by Lord Wolseley as a "Grecian Paradise" and local traders as a "bounty of plenty", it was fished, logged and hunted (deer, moose, bear, ducks and geese) in unheeded numbers until the 1970's. Today, after a century of permanent settlement nearby, very little survives but for the forest, water and migrating birds. In this age of diminishing resources and the need to conserve, the lesson of Elk Island demonstrates how fragile and delicate this damaged earth has become. The Elk Island Society was incorporated by citizens of Victoria Beach to enhance, maintain and preserve the natural wilderness ecosystem, restore and protect the fish, wildlife, waterfowl and bird habitat, and prevent further damage, exploitation or commercial development. While some politicians wanted a resort and others want gambling casinos, the Elk Island Society has consulted world leading experts to restock the first 250,000 pickeral in South Lake Winnipeg, create nests for hundreds of ducks, geese and songbirds, is protecting the piping plover nests (one of several endangered species), conducting shore and path cleanups, and a flora, fauna, bird and forest inventory. New members, volunteers and professionals are welcome to join and participate.

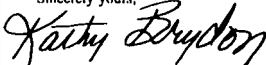

With regards to an announcement placed in the Herald on June 30, 1994 I would like to inform the cottagers of the following facts:

1. The R.M. of Victoria Beach Council did not apply to the Justice Department of Manitoba for permission to arm our Chief Constable. They in fact requested assistance as to how this process should be done within the parameters of the law. This matter is entirely a Council decision.
 2. Council was notified of an intention to arm by our Chief Constable due to a number of situations that have arisen in our Municipality. He was only requesting their blessing, not their approval, as this is granted under the Manitoba Provincial Police Act.
 3. The R.C.M.P. attended a Council meeting and was asked if there were any objections to arming the Constable and none was given. Do you not think that if the R.C.M.P. knew that Council was going to arm our Chief Constable and if there was a problem with this that they would not voice their concern? Council was informed that this was totally their decision.
 4. The Municipal Council has been informed by their insurance company that they are totally covered for any errors or omissions by your Police in the performance of their duties and this includes the carrying of firearms. However, Council may forbid the Officer to carry any firearms and in this instance the total liability for that Officer becomes the responsibility of the Council and Taxpayers of the R.M. of Victoria Beach.
 5. A petition was circulated throughout the Municipality and a sampling was taken from each sub-division within the Beach, eg: Albert Beach, Kroken Sub., Hampton Sub., Victoria Beach proper, etc. But a Councillor brought up the fact that the Cottagers Association should meet and form an opinion. If this arming of the constable is to be decided for some reason by the Beach residents then why is it restricted to the Cottagers Association and not a meeting of ALL beach residents and Cottagers?
- In closing, it is the duty of the Police to answer calls in our Beach. This is what we as residents expect. We also expect and deserve that, when the Police arrive, they can deal with the situation at hand. It has been proven over and over during the last 2 1/2 years that our Constable does attend and does deal with the problems whenever we call, day or night. Should we not therefore, give our Police the ability to protect our families and themselves from what is becoming a more dangerous environment? It has been stated that guns have never been needed in Victoria Beach and that they are not needed now. People who watch television and read newspapers might say differently.

Victoria Beach is a beautiful and quiet area and we as cottagers and residents must strive to keep it this way. We, as well as our Council, must change with the times. We must also take the responsibility to protect our Police as we fully expect them to take care of us, our families and our BEACH.
