Council Corner

Council has become aware that a number of people are planting trees and grass, and even erecting fences, or otherwise obstructing paths on the municipal road allowances, in front of their property. It should be remembered that the road allowances were left wide, on purpose, and that at one time there were walkways as well as roads on the road allowances. Pedestrians are encouraged to walk along these old pathways which may be slightly overgrown in order that they may be established once again in a safer area in which to walk.

With the advent of cars and increased non-summer use, it is necessary that every residence have a place to park their car as well as a place to pile brush and trees in the Spring and Fall. Council requests that residents consult their neighbours before making improvements to the municipal property in front of their property, so that space remains for these purposes.

Once again we would like to remind all residents that removal of trees and brush from municipal property without permission from council is an unlawful act (dead trees excepted).

Please consult the municipal council before removing brush or trees or before planting grass or trees on municipal property.

Cyclists are asked to cycle in a careful manner, especially at road crossings. Some roads have loose gravel or sand and a fast moving cyclist may easily take a fall. Cyclists should be cautious of hidden pathways from cottages, particularly those cottages whose front property line is close to the roadway. We are told that injuries from bicycle falls are amongst the commonest cause of visits to the doctor at the beach.

Scrabble Club Invents New Award - "The Atik"

Everyone knows about the Oscars, the Emmys, the Tonys, the Junos; now a new award is on the horizon - the Atik.

Initiative for the new award comes from the Victoria Beach Scrabble Club and would be presented to runners-up in the annual July tournament to determine the winner of the most sought-after prize in the world of Scrabbledom - the Elk Island Trophy.

The "Atik Award" is the brain child of the V.B. Scrabble Research Committee. Members of the committee delving into historical archives discovered that the aboriginal name for this community and the neighbouring island was Atik.

At the same time, the committee made another discovery - that the name Atik was mistranslated as "elk" when, in fact, the word means "caribou".

This second discovery has placed committee members on the horns not of a dilemma, but of an elk and a caribou. If the true name of Elk Island is Caribou Island, should the name of the premier Scrabble prize be changed to the Caribou Island Trophy? Scrabble players are, if anything, meticulous about the meaning of words and correct usage.

One suggestion from the committee is to retain the original name, but intertwine the elk antlers on the trophy with those of a caribou to acknowledge the new information.

Meanwhile, plans are going ahead for the first presentation of the Atik Awards (and the Elk/Caribou Island Trophy) at a gala occasion in July, 1995.

Organizers of the gala have recommended that the green space near the pier where the Victoria Beach Inn was located should be considered as a venue. They point out that the space is a natural amphitheatre easily adapted to a dramatic setting with the aid of quartz lights and lasers.

In another development, the V.B. Scrabble Founders' Committee has proposed the establishment of a "Hall of Fame" to honour great names in local Scrabble history. This proposal has become engulfed in controversy over the nomination procedure adopted to select candidates. Rank and file members are vociferous in their allegations that the Founders are favouring certain names, in some cases their own.
