Welcome back to the swim dock for another busy summer of swimming lessons. Registration is at the Clubhouse on Saturday, July 1st from 2:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m. and Sunday, July 2nd from 10:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m.

We offer the full Red Cross Water Safety Program of colours - yellow through white. We also offer the Royal Life Saving Program of Life Saving I, II, III, Bronze Medallion and Bronze Cross. We haven't forgotten the young or the old. Minnow classes are available from age 4 and up and adults can sign up for learn-to-swim classes, or to improve their strokes or just to come out for exercise.

The cost is \$5.00 per person to a maximum of \$10.00 per family plus a Victoria Beach Club Membership.

Big recycling changes for 1995

The Bluewater Regional Waste Management, which consists of the R.M. of Victoria Beach, the L.G.D. of Alexander, the Village of Powerview, the Village of Pine Falls, Grand Beach Provincial Park and the R.M. of St. Clements, is taking over the recycling program this summer.

By the end of July, there will be colour-coded collection bins at 8th and Alexander and beside the Summer Post Office to begin with.

In order to be eligible to receive a provincial government payment of \$152.00 per tonne, we must expand our recyclables to include all of the following:

1. PAPER PRODUCTS:
 1. Newspapers, including flyers
 2. Magazines
 3. Milk cartons (rinsed and flattened)
 4. Boxboard (flattened cereal, kleenex, shoe boxes, paper towel rolls, etc. - NO CORRUGATED BOXES).

II GLASS

1. Liquor bottles (caps removed)
2. Glass jars (washed, lids removed)

III OTHER

1. P.E.T. or No. 1 plastic containers (soft drink and some food products - washed and tops removed)
2. Aluminum cans
3. Steel cans (soup cans - washed, paper removed, top and bottom removed and put in flattened can)

We still have blue containers in many locations in the municipality which can take all of the above EXCEPT paper products. If

paper gets wet, it becomes garbage. Please use only the collection bins for paper products.

This is a major undertaking in the municipality and its success depends upon your support, your education of the whole family and your renters.


Lake Winnipeg water level information

May 1995

The following information is provided by the Water Resources Branch, Province of Manitoba, and published by Manitoba Hydro as a courtesy to those interested in the outlook for water levels on the lake.

LAKE WINNIPEG LEVEL FORECAST

Current conditions are: the wind eliminated level of Lake Winnipeg is 713.9 feet and is rising as a result of spring runoff. The water level forecast below shows the history of water levels on Lake Winnipeg for the past two years, the extremes that have occurred since 1912, and a range of future water levels for the next three months. The forecast shown "BEST ESTIMATE" will occur if present inflow trends continue. The remaining two forecasts show the range of possible levels given extreme wet or dry conditions. The forecast shown "WET" will result if rainfall over the Lake Winnipeg drainage basin is well above normal. The forecast "DRY" will result if precipitation is much below normal and evaporation from the lake is high.



LAKE WINNIPEG REGULATION

The level of Lake Winnipeg is regulated by Manitoba Hydro by a control structure at the Jenpeg Generating Station on the Nelson River near the outlet of the lake. While the wind eliminated level of Lake Winnipeg is between the UPPER STORAGE LIMIT of 715 feet and the LOWER STORAGE LIMIT of 711 feet, Manitoba Hydro regulates the lake for hydroelectric purposes. During periods when the water level is above 715 feet, Manitoba Hydro must operate the control structure at Jenpeg in such a manner to effect maximum discharge possible under the circumstances then prevailing until the water level of Lake Winnipeg recedes to 715 feet. During periods when the water level is below 711 feet, Manitoba Hydro must operate the control structure at Jenpeg as ordered by the Minister of Natural Resources.


