

Recycling News

What is this new recycling system?

The new recycling system means that there are

- 14 specially marked drop-off locations (opening July 31)
- two curbside pickup systems for recyclable materials

in the region made up of the following areas:

The Bluewater region:

- Local Government District of Alexander
- Rural Municipality of Victoria Beach
- Ward 6 (northern part) of the Rural Municipality of St. Clements
- Grand Beach Provincial Park
- Village of Powerview
- Town of Pine Falls

Each depot is made up of three or four large black bins with different coloured caps. The caps tell which materials go into each bin

BLUE CAP: Newspapers and flyers, magazines and catalogues, cardboard (cereal boxes, shoe boxes), milk cartons (not plastic jugs)

GREEN CAP: Tin cans, aluminum cans, PET (#1 plastic) bottles (soft drink bottles)

RED CAP: All glass food and beverage containers.

So What do you need to do?

SEPARATE. Remember to separate the recyclable materials as soon as you've used them.

RINSE AND FLATTEN: Food and beverage containers should be completely empty and rinsed if possible. Dirty containers will soon smell and attract insects. Flattening plastic and metal containers greatly reduces the cost to recycle them. Step on them before you deposit them.

DEPOSIT IN THE RIGHT BIN. Make sure that each material goes into the correct bin. Mixing up materials increases the cost of your recycling program.

What will happen to the recyclables?

All the recyclables collected in the bins will be recycled. Each material may end up in more than one product.

Newspapers, Flyer, Magazines, Catalogues, Boxboard: Used to make new paper or paper products and insulation.

Milk Cartons: Used to make very high quality papers.
