





Autobiography of a Mayfly

Today is the first day of my life. It will more than likely be the last. I am a Mayfly. I'm certain you've seen me before. My season has begun. In two or three weeks you may have forgotten all about me, but I ask you please, read on, and discover who and why I am.

I am from the Order of Ephemeroptera genus Mayfly. I am also commonly called fishly, dayfly, sandfly, shadfly and drake. Fossil records show that my ancestors date back to 300 million years ago. There are over 200 species of my kind and we can be found in every continent except Antarctica.

Many of you know that my adult life is short lived and entirely for the purpose of reproduction. Did you know, however, that my life began a year ago when the last generation of mayflies laid their eggs. I quickly hatched out of this first stage of my life and into my second stage as a nymph. During this time I played an important role in the energy transfer cycle of water by consuming diatoms and algae. When my nymphal growth was complete, my skin split and a pair of wings emerged. At this time (the 3rd stage of my life), I left the water and headed to a sheltered area (perhaps your cottage?). Here, overnight, occurred a final skin shedding and my present adult form emerged. I am the only insect in existence that sheds its skin after developing functional wings.

This, my last stage of life, will last only a few hours of as many as two days. At dusk I shall fly to the water and engage in a mating dance with other Mayflies. The females will die while laying as many as 10,000 eggs and since in adult form we have no functioning mouthparts, the males will be soon to follow. Many of us will become food for birds, fish, bats, spiders, dragonflies and squirrels. We may also mistake black-topped roots and roadways for water and spend our final mating time there.

In the passing of a few summer weeks, my entire generation will have lived and died. So I ask you, please, give us more than a passing thought. Perhaps you could learn from an insect that lives only to give life to its next generation. We have served our purpose well. Look out for your own. Mine will see you next year.

Enjoy your tennis; enjoy the tournaments and remember to show consideration for the other players.
