

From the Editor


We are now half way through the summer. It has literally flown by - with warm days and cool nights, who could ask for anything more.



Scrabble finalists celebrate with tasty alphabet soup

The ever-expanding world of competitive Scrabble at Victoria Beach is abuzz with the news that the International Scrabble Authority in The Hague, Netherlands, has approved the use of the Chinese word "qi" (pronounced "chee") in official tournaments. The authority said the prevalence of the word among trendy new age fitness buffs addicted to Oriental calisthenics had prompted their decision.

Finalists preparing for Saturday's play-off and the honour of claiming the celebrated Elk Island Trophy hailed the decision as a progressive move in adding flexibility and excitement in the deployment of the letter "qi", till now only playable in conjunction with the letter "u".

Meanwhile, Scrabble enthusiasts turned out in hordes this week at the Double A Games and Leisure complex on Sandy Bay to witness the return of the Trophy to its display case at the tournament site.

A crowning touch to preparations for Saturday's final encounter was provided by Lucy's Catering Service of Traverse Bay, whose owner announced that a special alphabet soup, featuring the letter "q" was being concocted to celebrate the Scrabble Authority's decision.

Full details of the tournament final, and the name of the 1995 winner of the Elk Island Trophy will be available in next week's *Herald*. Among favourites to carry off the glittering prize are veteran constantans L. Storski, M. Kaye, A. Adamson and the redoubtable J. Fridfinnson-Elliott, a representative of the "new wave" of younger players and co-winner of the Trophy last year.

One riddle leads to another for Elk Island search party

A task force of nineteen volunteers that waded across to Elk Island July 19th in search of the ivory antler missing from the Elk Island Trophy (awarded annually to the V.B. Scrabble Champion) returned to Sandy Beach empty handed. But before the day was out, another mystery was added to the puzzle over the antler's whereabouts.

The search party, led by J. Norjén, L. Butler and P. Tinkler, was acting on an anonymous tip that the prized antler was buried near the site of the former Island Bible Camp, and a few yards

from the federal government Geodetic Survey Marker. After a detour around a shoreline crawling with pygmy loads, the party located the Survey Marker, but found no trace of the missing antler.

(Attentive readers of the *Herald* will recall the sensational disappearance of the Trophy two summers ago and its subsequent recovery a year later by children playing on King Edward Beach, who found it under a large rock. But missing then, and still missing, is one of the Trophy's antlers, fashioned from walrus ivory tusk by a Cape Dorset Inuit sculptor.)

Last winter, the Trophy - sans one antler - had been on view at the Saga Cafe in Arbog, home town of the 1994 co-winner. The July 19th search party had hoped to locate the missing antler before Saturday's Trophy presentation to the 1995 winner.

Their hopes dashed in their major quest, the task force turned its attention to a secondary mission, to monitor the Elk Island Society's ambitious plans to safeguard the island as a nature sanctuary, widely publicized in past years in the *Herald*, the *Winnipeg Free Press* and by word of mouth.

A major component in the Society's program was a project to dredge a channel from the lake to replenish the wetland marsh inland from the island's eastern shoreline. The searchers found no trace of this project, and since the marshy wetland seemed to be thriving, they concluded that nature was managing very well on its own, without human intervention or the dispensation of Society funds.

So the band of volunteers were left with unanswered questions to ponder: was the tip about the location of the antler a hoax? If it was, where then was the antler hidden? And what had happened to the Society's program?

Mystery upon mystery. But the island offered no clues to their solution. The missing antler, the invisible Society - both remained as riddles in the sand.


