## For Your Information: The Sewage and Liquid Waste Situation in the RM of Victoria Beach

The following report is a summary of the report that was undertaken by the Long Range Planning Committee and submitted to Council on May 21, 1996. This study was undertaken at the request of Council. The Long Range Planning Committee chaired by David Henderson, consists of the following members: Ken Capelle, Jim Daly, Margaret Robinson, and Dave Stevenson.

Council is presently considering these recommendations with a view to taking action in the fall.

The greater part of Victoria Beach is blessed with soil conditions which have been able to handle septic field, sullage (grey water pit) and outdoor biffy facilities for the disposal of human and household liquid wastes.

While a number of public deep wells have experienced contamination over the years, the piped municipal water supply and the use of cisterns appeared to have minimized the possibility of soil and water contamination.

However, as more and more cottages were constructed, enlarged or rehabilitated, and as the number of indoor bathrooms, flush toilets, sinks, tubs, showers, kitchen sinks, garburators, dishwashers and washing machines increased, the volume of discharge into existing pits, tanks, septic tanks or onto the ground is accelerating at an unforeseen rate.

Similarly, the recreation season is now four months longer and there is a trend to permanent occupancy by retired persons. The recent designation of guest houses on the same sites as cottages will also contribute to the increased sewage and waste water volumes into private septic field and grey pit facilities or straight out onto the ground.

In some low-lying areas with high water tables and no piped water supply, concern has developed with respect to the possible threat to the safety of deep well water sources employed by some of the residents in those areas.

With the enactments of *The Environment Act Regulations* in 1988, the process of requiring holding tanks with both sewage and sullage chambers is gradually being applied to all municipalities, including Victoria Beach. Anyone now constructing a new cottage, guest house, major addition or renovation must apply to the Province for a private sewage approved holding tank designed for pump-out. Similarly, any existing septic field which fails, must be removed and replaced by an approved holding tank.

This Municipality has participated in the construction of an approved sewage lagoon in the I.G.D. of Alexander and has been able to cope with the demands of three firms which provide pump-out services to property owners now served by holding tanks.

The Victoria Beach Long Range Advisory Planning Committee has filed a comprehensive report on this subject with Council. That report was prepared at the request of Council in order that Council and all

property owners might be made aware of any implications of enforcement of *The Environment Act Regulations* for both the municipality and the property owner. That report contained a number of observations and recommendations which are summarized as follows:

1. THAT Council cause a By-law to be prepared and which incorporates the provisions of *The Environment Act* together with any special conditions peculiar to the RM of Victoria Beach situation, thus shifting the responsibility for enforcement and inspection to the Municipality.  
The Village of Donnotar By-law (Matlock Pohnema and Whytewold), while dealing with a much more urgent situation, was recommended as a model for such a By-law. That By-law encompassed the need to require holding tank installations of the property owner and the operation of the pump-out service and the lagoon as a public utility cost to be borne by all property owners.
2. THAT Council see that any building or major renovation project be the subject of a building permit and that no construction is commenced until a holding tank is installed under *The Environment Act Regulations*.
3. THAT Council institute a comprehensive inspection program over the next year or two in order to develop an accurate record of existing private sewage and sullage disposal systems and outdoor biffies throughout the municipality. That inspection experience would also serve as the basis for an ongoing inspection responsibility under the proposed Sewage Disposal By-law.
4. THAT Council develop a schedule for the phased elimination of private sewage disposal systems and inadequate outdoor biffies through the mandatory installation of holding tanks and the removal by owners of obsolete systems — save biffies — over a specified number of years.
5. THAT Council engage the services of a professional engineering firm to assist in the development of a Sewage Management/Disposal Management Plan which will co-ordinate the suggested phased-in program and the anticipated need to expand the sewage treatment lagoon system in a few years.
6. THAT Council develop a well-conceived informational program in order that all property owners be made aware of the implications of enforcement of *The Environment Act Regulations*. This communication is a start in that direction.

Upon presentation of its report to Council, the Advisory Planning Committee stressed the need for the development of a 10-15 year plan for conversion to a holding tank standard and the enlargement of the sewage lagoon capacity to accommodate same.

The use of a Municipal By-law designed to accomplish the phase-in and provide for sewage disposal as a public utility to be shared by all property owners, not unlike the water service utility, was seen as the means to allow for all concerned to make their plans—both physical and financial—without being faced with a sudden and disruptive situation in the very near future.

The Advisory Committee did express concerns for the preservation and general character and uniqueness of Victoria Beach and the Restricted Area in particular. While recognizing that changes in our approach toward the handling of sewage and liquid waste water may be necessary, fear of negative impacts of more large, noisy and foul-smelling trucks appearing on a regular basis and the potential need to improve the roads were voiced.

It is the hope of the Advisory Committee that professional engineers may be able to define economic alternative methods or technology to avert the need for lagoon expansion and the abandonment of the septic field and grey pit concept.

The Advisory Committee pointed out that it has been restricted to what it understands to be the law and the responsibility of the Council to uphold the intent of that law, namely protection of the environment. However, it has argued for a plan which would phase-in change and minimize hardship upon present and future property owners who ascribe to the Victoria Beach way of life.


## Lake Winnipeg water level information

May 1996

The following information is provided by the Water Resources Branch, Province of Manitoba, and published by Manitoba Hydro as a courtesy to those interested in the outlook for water levels on the lake.

### LAKE WINNIPEG LEVEL FORECAST

As of May 15, the wind eliminated level of Lake Winnipeg is 714.1 feet and rising due to the spring runoff. The lake is still ice covered. The water level forecast below shows the history of water levels on Lake Winnipeg for the past two years, the extremes that have occurred since 1912, and a range of future water levels for the next three months. The forecast shown "BEST ESTIMATE" will occur if present inflow trends continue. The remaining two forecasts show the range of possible levels given extreme wet or dry conditions. The forecast shown "WET" will result if rainfall over the Lake Winnipeg drainage basin is well above normal. The forecast "DRY" will result if precipitation is much below normal and evaporation from the lake is high.



### LAKE WINNIPEG REGULATION

The level of Lake Winnipeg is regulated by Manitoba Hydro by a control structure at the Jenpeg Generating Station on the Nelson River near the outlet of the lake. While the wind eliminated level of Lake Winnipeg is between the UPPER STORAGE LIMIT of 715 feet and the LOWER STORAGE LIMIT of 711 feet, Manitoba Hydro regulates the lake for hydroelectric purposes. During periods when the water level is above 715 feet, Manitoba Hydro must operate the control structure at Jenpeg in such a manner to effect maximum discharge possible under the circumstances then prevailing until the water level of Lake Winnipeg recedes to 715 feet. During periods when the water level is below 711 feet, Manitoba Hydro must operate the control structure at Jenpeg as ordered by the Minister of Natural Resources.




## Water Safety Wisdom

1. Watch children whenever they are near water.
2. Arrange for your children to enrol in classes to learn safe swimming. Make sure that you also know water safety procedures. Remember, young folk move quickly, watch them at all times.
3. Plastic toys are fun but **HAZARDOUS** in the water. The slightest breeze can carry them into deep water.
4. **Don't** allow non-swimmers to use inner tubes or inflatable supports, false confidence in these supports may cost their lives.
5. **Do not** permit swimming in unfamiliar waters. A responsible adult should check the area for drop-offs, currents, a safe bottom, and water purity.
6. **Don't** swim in the dark .... it's VERY dangerous.
7. Boating or swimming alone is risky. A child or adult may panic when no help is near. Always have a "buddy" with you.
8. **Never** overestimate swimming skills, your own or others.
9. Know and teach the use of simple and safe "reaching assists". Helping someone in trouble in the water is easy ... lie flat, extend an arm, leg, paddle or clothing to reach the person in difficulty. Learn how to throw a buoyant support or rescue line.
10. Plan ahead to prevent boat accidents. Don't overload a boat. If the boat capsizes, stay with the boat and hang-on. A boat can be seen more easily than a swimmer.
11. Lifejackets can only be effective in the water if they are securely tied in advance.
12. When overheated from excessive activity, stay out of the water. Cool down before you go in.
13. Know how to administer rescue breathing. Make sure every member of your family knows this simple method of resuscitation which has saved thousands of lives.
14. **Remember...** rock climbing and show-off activities bring many risks.

## Council Corner

## Animal Control Bylaw

Responding to a strong demand, Council has passed a revised and strengthened animal control bylaw, with an officer appointed to make it effective. The bylaw states that dogs must be leashed at all times when off the owner's property, and even then must not be free to roam the streets to harass pedestrians or cyclists. Further, dogs will not be allowed to disturb the peace by barking or howling. From June 1st until after Labor Day, dogs will not be permitted under any circumstances on swimming beaches between the hours of 10:00 a.m. and 8:00 p.m.. Owners walking their dogs will at all times be responsible for removing their dog feces from public and private property. A fine of \$50.00 will be levied on offenders. If a dog has been impounded, a fine of \$50.00 must be paid at the gate prior to release. A kenneling fee of \$12.50 per day will be charged beginning on the third day. Dogs unclaimed after five days will be turned over to the Humane Society.

It is recognized that the vast majority of dog owners will not likely be affected by these regulations as they are already acting responsibly. In fact, it is often dog owners themselves who have complained of dogs rushing out and attacking their leashed pets. In recent years, small children have been terrorized and bitten by dogs running loose, and no one appreciates children stepping in "doggie doo-doo" or digging it up while playing at the beach.

The method of contacting the animal control officer will be through the Information Office at the gate (not the parking lot) at 756-2725, or after hours through the police at 756-2322.


