Andrika will be on the swim dock during these hours to take new registrations. (In very rainy weather, she would be at the Clubhouse.)



• Parents of young cyclists at VB might wish to check their children's bikes regularly to ensure their child's safety.

- 1) Bent and destroyed the kickstand.
- 2) Disconnected the hand brake cable from the brake pads, rendering the brakes useless.

Council Corner

Last call for voting notification. Election day for RM is Friday, July 24th. Polls will be open from 8 am to 8 p.m. at the Clubhouse and the Seniors' Scene at the beach, and the Victoria Beach Municipal Office, 303-960 Portage Avenue in Winnipeg. How you vote will result in the council that will represent your interests for the next 4 years.

Police Services

Many residents have expressed the thought that Victoria Beach is a crime-free summer paradise. This is purely an illusion for which we can thank the vigilance of the members of our police department. Our four-man summer force has been increased this year by a part time constable to facilitate the 24 hour coverage that we now have during the May to Labour Day period. Since Council approved funding two years ago to provide extra coverage between Thanksgiving and first snowfall, cottage break-ins during this vulnerable period have been reduced drastically compared to surrounding vacation areas.

Last year there were 30 charges laid under the Highway Traffic Act, 61 by-law infractions, 18 medical calls, 20 Liquor Control Act charges, and 49 Criminal Code infractions including stalking, death threats, assault with weapons, break-ins, thefts and vandalism among other activities. Although Narcotics Control Act violations were down last year our local policing is not an unnecessary frill.

Please remember safety considerations in all matters, especially in regards to the lake.

VB Summer Doctors

Yes, we have doctors in residence all summer — and what great people they are! Would you believe they prefer to ride bikes for house calls rather than drive? All our summer doctors hail from the St. James Street Clinic.

The doctors will change every two weeks on Saturdays and will cover most weeks through September 7th.
