

SWIM PROGRAM NEWS


The swim program has now been running for two weeks, serving over 200 swimmers from the first, with more registering daily. Thanks to Jenny, Mary, Lindsay and Lisa the program has quickly smoothed out one or two minor problems and seems to be up and running well. Thanks also to John Brydon's spring work, and to last minute repairs and adjustments by Ivan McMorris, Murray MacRae and John McManus (the Celtic Crew?) our dock, touching wood, has not been as much of a problem for us as we have come to expect over the past few years!

I would also like to thank, and introduce where this might be necessary, Diane and Joe Bailey, who have offered to take over the position of swimming coordinator(s) next year. For the rest of this year they'll be helping out and generally getting their feet...wet...so you'll see them around.

That was the good news...Now...just wait while I get my growing mask on...

As a part of my annual reminders, I'd like to ask Clubhouse Beach-goers (whose numbers have grown over the years from very, very few to hundreds and hundreds) to please respect the space of the swim classes as they are being conducted on the beach. Swim classes held on the beach are beginner levels, usually full of young and often very nervous swimmers who are easily intimidated, even by splashing, crowding, and balls flying overhead. Our worst problem, however, is children not involved in a class who pester and otherwise disrupt the lesson. Parents, we'd appreciate it if you'd speak to your kids about this in particular.

A second problem involves dogs running loose on the beach or at the dock. Your dog may be harmless



and he may indeed only be playing, but if you're not there to control him, nobody knows that, especially the little kids who are smaller than the dog that is barking and lunging around them. The fact that these free-running dogs are also there illegally means that if they cause too much grief, we'll be able to get the authorities to round them up. Two dogs already are on our "bad dog!" list in this regard. (Know any shepherd/shepherd cross dogs, one large, one medium-sized, that you're letting out of the cottage or the yard in the mornings?)

Our third problem has not been a big one yet this year, but was very distressing last year. Young riders of Sea-doo-type watercraft have been buzzing far, far too close to the swimming dock and ignoring instructor's requests to stay away. Municipal by-laws regulate a minimum 150-ft leeway that all watercraft must give to swimmers. If you have children or teens using personal watercraft, please review the boating laws with them, and consider supervising them more closely. This is truly dangerous behavior.

(Removing mask...) Have a good, safe week!

NEW! SYNCHRO SWIM CLINIC!

Nicole Bachynski, of the Winnipeg Naiads Synchro Club (formerly Bushido) has offered to give synchronized swim classes to Victoria Beachers during the week of July 18 to July 22. If you're interested, here are the details:

Classes will be from 10:00 - 10:30 every morning of the week, at the swim dock. Head swim instructor Jenny Butler will act as lifeguard. Cost for the week is five dollars. It is recommended that swimmers have completed level six swimming at the very least, since this is a deep water class that involves a lot of being underwater, upside down, etc. You'll need to be a reasonably confident and strong swimmer.

Unfortunately, this notice was too late for the last Herald, so your best bet for registration will be to call me over the weekend @ 756-6326 or drop by 339-3rd (Please don't expect anyone else in my family to be able to register you. Best bet, though not guaranteed, times to get me will be 9:30 a.m. - 12:30 p.m.) Once classes have started on the Monday, see Jenny on the dock during the 10:00 - 10:30 registration time. Class numbers will be limited, but we'll take a waiting list and an interest list for possible further clinics, if you can be arranged.





GROUND FLOOR PLAN




SECTION ON A.A.
