

Tennis Tournament

Manitoba's biggest tennis tournament will be at your service for the entirety of the long weekend. Qualifying rounds will finish Saturday evening and semi-finals and finals will start Monday morning. The draw will be posted by Friday at 6:00 p.m. and matches will commence at 8:00 a.m. sharp Saturday morning. As was the case with the last few years, we will use the "next match on" format. For example, for the first draw Saturday morning, matches one through six will go on at 8:00. Match number seven must be ready to go when the first court opens up - whenever that may be - and so on, through the nearly 200 matches we expect to be played. Also as in past years, due to the size of the draw and our limited court time, we will be using no-ad scoring for at least the preliminary rounds. (At Deuce, the returner gets to choose what side to receive the sudden-death game point.)

The tournament committee reserves the right to change the format as time permits.

The eligibility rules have been spelled out in past editions of the Herald, but to reiterate, Victoria Beach Club members who have turned 18 by December 31, 1999 are eligible to play in the Senior Open. Juniors who have won an event in the junior tournament two weeks ago, are also eligible to play in that respective event. Non-members must buy a season-long club membership. Events are \$4 each and all dues must be paid prior to your first matches. (If you have any doubts that this rule will be enforced, look deep into Les Carter's eyes.) Would last year's winners also return the trophies to the courts on Sunday. (And if you've yet to order your plaque for last year's victory, here's your final reminder.)

We guarantee there won't be any last minute needs for an organizer this year, but we would appreciate some volunteers to help with putting matches on and recording scores. There is a sign up sheet at the tennis courts. Please, no shoving.



Lake Winnipeg water level information



The following information is provided by the Water Resources Branch, Province of Manitoba, and published by Manitoba Hydro as a courtesy to those interested in the outlook for water levels on the lake.

LAKE WINNIPEG LEVEL FORECAST

On July 15, the wind eliminated level of Lake Winnipeg was 714.5 feet and is expected to rise. The water level forecast below shows the history of water levels on Lake Winnipeg for the past two years, the monthly extremes that have occurred since 1913, and a range of future water levels for the next two months. The forecast shown "BEST ESTIMATE" will occur if present inflow trends continue. The remaining two forecasts show the range of possible levels given extreme wet or dry conditions. The lake's level is expected to peak in late July and then to decline during the following two months. Of course, the lake's level may go up and down, depending on the precipitation.

LAKE WINNIPEG REGULATION

The outflow of Lake Winnipeg is regulated by Manitoba Hydro by a control structure at Jenpeg Generating Station on the Nelson River near the outlet of the lake. While the wind eliminated level of Lake Winnipeg is between 711 feet and 715 feet, Manitoba Hydro regulates outflows from the lake as required for power production purposes. During periods when the water level is above 715 feet, Manitoba Hydro must operate the control structure at Jenpeg in such a manner to effect maximum outflow possible under the circumstances then prevailing until the water level of Lake Winnipeg recedes to 715 feet. During periods when the water level is below 711 feet, Manitoba Hydro must operate the control structure at Jenpeg as ordered by the Minister of Conservation. In addition to the control structure at Jenpeg, the Lake Winnipeg Regulation project included the removal of restrictions in existing channels and the excavation of new channels to improve outflows from the lake. This work increased the maximum outflow capacity of the lake by up to 50 per cent, meaning that in high water periods or high electricity demand periods, more water can be passed out of the lake more quickly than prior to Lake Winnipeg Regulation. Therefore, extended high water periods and flooding around the lake are significantly reduced.
