



Swim Program 2001

Are you ready for another summer of swimming lessons at the beach? We are! Your team this year is myself, Meghan Gray, as the Swim Program Convener (taking over from the oh so great Pat MacRae and hoping not to cry on her shoulder too too much!) and Jenny Butler and Mary Birley, who are again sharing the Head Instructor/Guard position, and instructors Danny Birley and Laura Burr.

Swim lessons will start on the holiday Monday, July 2, and run six weeks until Friday, August 12, 2000. Registration Day will take place on Sunday, July 1, from 1:00-3:00 p.m., at the Clubhouse.

As usual, all registration will be first-come, first-served. The cost for lessons is still the best bargain in Canada at \$10.00 per child per class, whether for one week or for six, payable on Registration Day.

Bronze-level lifesaving classes and AquaLeaders will have additional fees of between \$10 and \$45-50, depending on level and need for textbooks. These will be paid directly to instructors when due. Please also note that people in default of payment from last year will not be allowed to register this year until their account is cleared by cash payment.

Please remember that all swimmers must be at least three years old when they start attending classes. No exceptions. Aquatots classes for younger children and a parent/caregiver will be scheduled if there is enough interest. Don't forget the Lifesaving Society programs: the Swim Patrol more or less replaces Lifesaving I, II, and III, but the Bronze Star fills a gap, accommodating those 12 and 13-year olds for whom there used to be nothing but waiting to be eligible for the Bronze Medallion. In the interests of reducing the chaos of Registration Day, PLEASE note the following procedure:

BRING/KNOW:

- a VB Club membership card for each registrant (memberships available on-site)
- Medical Insurance Numbers for each registrant cash or chequebook
- relevant medical conditions of each registrant (asthma, allergies, etc.)
- expected date of departure (see below)
- your own pen (recommended)

STEP ONE/AREA ONE

Choose Your Classes

- pick up a registration form and a swim program policy statement from the first table as you enter.
- Check out the big program schedule poster to find your preferred classes.
- Fill in your registration form; read the policy document. (If the Step 3 line is long do it in line.)

STEP TWO/TABLE TWO

Get a Membership, if you haven't got one.

STEP THREE/TABLE THREE

Get Signed Up/Fees Calculated

- There will be four lines at this area, each ending in one of the four instructors, who will get you assigned to classes. Any instructor can register you for all classes. Just pick the shortest line (!)

STEP FOUR/TABLE FOUR - Pay

- Payment is by cash or cheque (payable to Victoria Beach Club).
- Please use line-up time to have your cheques ready, if possible.

As usual, we will do our best to have the various areas/tables well labeled, but as usual we rely on our experienced VB'ers to help anyone looking overwhelmed (hopefully it's not me!). Thank you in advance.

Again, we are asking you to know your expected date of departure.

Too often we have found that suddenly a child will greet the instructor with "This is my last day today". Of course, the instructor, not having known this, has not prepared a progress report, and cannot stop to do so now. The child is disappointed. We hope that asking for this date in advance will minimize the problem. The date is not intended to be binding. You are free to change your mind, though we will still require two or three days notice if you decide to leave earlier than your stated date. As well, if you decide to stay longer, some notice would be appreciated as it will prevent the wasted time and expense of preparing documents prematurely.

If you cannot attend Registration Day, either Mary or Jenny will be found on the dock every weekday morning from 10:00-10:25 to take new registrations. Please be prompt. They cannot go beyond the time. As well, please ensure that you have all registrant's membership cards and medical insurance numbers and either cash or cheque payment.

Endure Registration Day and then enjoy the summer!

In Memoriam



Doreen Benningen (1919-2001)

Sadly, this past winter, we lost Doreen Benningen, a long-time Victoria Beach cottager. Many will remember that Doreen was the first woman municipal councillor elected at Victoria Beach and that she held that position for eight years. Her long and dedicated work for our community actually started with family visits in 1948 and continued when she became a full-time summer resident in 1957.

Through the years, in addition to her long service on council (which started in 1965), Doreen worked on the Herald as Assistant Editor; joined the VB Club Executive and was eventually recognized as Honorary President of the club for 18 years!

A permanent legacy of her contribution to our summer resort was her leadership in converting the former railroad station and cinder track into the verdant and picturesque "Village Green."

G. Doreen Benningen (nee Hunter) was born on June 21, 1919, in Mather, Manitoba and raised in Balduf. She met her husband, Henry J (Hank) at Clear Lake, Manitoba. They married on December 27, 1940 in Winnipeg.

More insight into her years of service to Victoria Beach can be found in excerpts from Dodie Dennehy's tribute to Doreen which originally appeared in the Herald in 1973.

Tribute To Retired Councillor Doreen Benningen

Stepping into the shoes of Doreen Benningen is not going to be a "walk-away", and having read through some small part of her meticulously kept files, now in my possession, I am very much aware of the planning, research, thought and time, which, after eight years of mostly sheer perseverance, have accomplished so much for all of you.

Consider the following (which are just a fraction of the projects undertaken):

1. The Village Green - a pile of cinder and deserted track - eight years ago.
2. The Sports Field - long, waving grass, activity - nil - except for the occasional swipe with a dull scythe before Sports Day.
3. The first Children's Playground - an original, delightful idea, solely attributed to councillor Benningen.
4. Bicycle racks throughout the beach - her own design.
5. Benches at strategic spots throughout the parks and beaches.
6. Development of Pier Point.
7. Beach boys and park cleaners - making our children aware of litter, creating their first paid jobs and making such a difference to our paths and beaches.

8. Liaison with the Victoria Beach Club. Your Club needs the Municipality to maintain the grounds, lend us professional help and use of equipment and Doreen saw that we got it.

9. Keeping the Herald up to date on Council activities. While Doreen Benningen was in her second term of office and making her presence felt as an important member of council, the Victoria Beach Club came to life. Let us show our appreciation for her efforts by our individual attention to safeguarding the beauty, efficiency and progress of Victoria Beach.

Dodie Dennehy

Upon her retirement from VB Council, Doreen wrote the following poem about our community. It reflects her love of the beach and it reminds us of her endless dedication to a place we all continue to cherish.

I think that I shall never see
A poem lovely as V.B.
A place where happy children play
And old rejoice with each new day.
Where poison ivy is controlled
And pier and beaches are patrolled.
Where no environmentalist finds fault
With dusty roads controlled with salt.
Where cars are kept within the lot
Yet cabs arrive right on the dot.
Where vandals never have their day
For that is not the V.B. way.
Where sandy beaches, stable banks
Are free from children's silly pranks.
Where all comment on perfect beaches
With canine friends restrained on leashes.
Where roads are gravelled spring and fall
So bicyclists can have a ball.
Where perfect boundaries are set
So Regionalism is no threat.
Where brush and garbage annual tenders
Ne'er a criticism renders.
Where water flows through plastic pipe
Annulling urban users' gripe.
Where no one needs to fear a fire
With tandem truck and siren crier.
Where at the municipal shop
The work goes on around the clock.
Where all, their feelings may express
And, in so doing, find redress.
Where any one may be elected
And do the job as was expected.



Historical VB Cottage Trivia

■ Did you know that 317 - 1st..... (now owned by William and Mary Duff, and known as "Duffer's Inn" since 1968)..... was originally constructed like a CNR boxcar in 1931?

No studs were used in the original cottage walls. They were constructed like the old boxcars out of 2X4 double tongue-and-groove, nailed on top of one another. Thus, the original name of the cottage "Lockwood".

■ Garth and Patricia Armstrong relate that the cottage at 115 Simst was built by Alfred Ateah around 1917. They say that (Grandad) Fred de Courcy Davies first came to Victoria Beach by boat, before the train arrived.

He was apparently a Federal Government Engineer and oversaw the construction of the first VB Pier. The Armstrong's grandchildren are the fifth generation to enjoy the cottage!

Council Corner

Summer Doctor(s)

The summer clinic will be operated by a team of Doctors sharing the duties, on a rotating basis. The Doctors are from the same Winnipeg clinic as last year (St. James Street Clinic). They will cover the entire months of July and August. The office is located at 124 Birch and the clinic hours are as follows:

Tuesday to Saturday -- 9:30 a.m. to 11:30 a.m.

5:30 p.m. to 7:30 p.m.

Sunday & Monday -- 5:30 p.m. to 7:30 p.m.

Please present your Manitoba Health Insurance

Registration number to the attending Doctor and pay for all medications.

Brush Piles

The Municipality will not remove any refuse from the brush piles other than leaves and brush. All other refuse such as building materials, brush from lot clearing, appliances, mattresses, furniture, etc. must be removed by the property owner at his/her own expense. Such refuse is to be transported to the Traverse Bay dump on Highway #11. Brush is not to be placed on the road allowance in late June, July or August. Anyone found contravening the provisions of By-law #1274 (Anti-dumping By-Law) can be charged, by our police, for illegally dumping refuse.

Noise

Under By-law #1408, the carrying on of any excavation or construction work is prohibited between the hours of 8:00 p.m. and 8:00 a.m. This includes the operation of power tools, lawn mowers, etc... The Noise By-law also includes provisions regarding unreasonable noises such as loud music, rowdiness, parties, etc... Anyone contravening the provisions of this By-law may be subject to a maximum fine of \$1000.00 and the costs of prosecution. Fines may also be levied against the owner where the property is rented or leased.

Unauthorized Work on Municipal Property

By-law #1411 prohibits the unauthorized removal, clearing, excavation and/or alteration of municipal property. Property owners are warned that removing trees or undertaking any other type of private work on municipal property without Council's permission is strictly prohibited. Offenders will be fined and ordered to restore the property otherwise the Municipality will restore the property and charge the costs to the responsible party. All costs and fines can be charged to the property owner's tax account, if necessary.

Recycling

Our recycling program continues. Please flatten all your recyclables whenever possible as this greatly increases the capacity of the bins. **NO GARBAGE PLEASE.**

Garbage

Garbage will be removed weekly from late June to Labour Day. Garbage must be kept in garbage cans lined with plastic garbage bags and left in the yard, not on the street.

Dogs

Pursuant to By-law #1412, dogs must be on a leash at all times and are not allowed on the beach under any circumstances between the hours of 10:00 a.m. and 8:00 p.m. from June 1st to Labour Day, both inclusive. Owners must pick-up their dog's excrement from public and private property. These and other provisions of By-law #1412 will be enforced by the Dog Control Officer and/or the Municipal Police.

Water Consumption/Usage

Water pressure problems have occurred in dry summers due to the indiscriminate watering of lawns. The Victoria Beach water system is presently operating near capacity and will require major upgrading in the very near future. Water consumption restrictions may be imposed if low water pressure problems arise. All water customers are requested to exercise water conservation measures at all times and to refrain from excessive water usage. Property owners are reminded that the water from municipal hand pumps is not tested and is not potable. You are advised to refrain from using this water.

Water Testing Procedures

Water samples are taken from various locations by our Public Works staff (for each municipal water system) once every two weeks. Samples are taken and delivered to Enviro-Test Labs in Winnipeg. Test results are reported to the Municipality. If test results are inadequate, Enviro-Test Labs notifies the Environment Officer at Selkirk. The Environment Officer will then request that another group of samples be taken and delivered to the Lab. If subsequent test results continue to indicate that there is a water quality problem, the Environment Officer will request that the Municipality take corrective measures.

Building Permits/Planning

Building permit applications are available at the Municipal Office and Gate Information Office (in the summer only). Building permits can only be issued by the Building Inspector, Russ Clifton. Property owners are reminded to obtain a permit before proceeding with any work to avoid delays, fines and additional costs. Please check with the Building Inspector or the Municipal office staff before proceeding with any building plans.

Water Safety

There are no lifeguards at any of the Municipality's beaches. All Red Cross safety regulations should be followed when boating, swimming or simply being near the water. It is of particular importance for parents to constantly watch young children when they are on the beaches or in the lake.

Beach Kids

The sign-up date for beach kids is Tuesday, July 3, 2001 at 11:00 a.m. at the Parks Department building near the tennis courts. There are twenty routes in the restricted area and applicants are expected to spend about half an hour per day cleaning their assigned areas for which they receive a \$5.00 honorarium per week.

First Responders

We have trained Emergency Medical Responders to provide on-site medical attention while awaiting the arrival of an ambulance. The First Responders will be carrying pagers and will be paged when a 911 call is received.

Civic Addressing / 911

The 911 service was implemented in December 2000. This service allows callers, within the Municipality, to dial 911 for emergencies only (Police, Fire & Medical). It is imperative that all property owners remove any old addressing from their properties and display the civic number assigned to them by the Municipality on their property in a location which is clearly visible from the street. This will minimize the response time in emergency situations. **FOR EMERGENCIES WITHIN THE R. M. OF VICTORIA BEACH DIAL 911.**

Golf Course News

It's time to welcome all golfers back for another season. We started the course preparation April 16th with very little snow to contend with, and the course opened on May 1st.

As is often the case, the course didn't winter well. Late rains in November, followed by freezing temperatures, left an ice cover over the course. Before it could melt, we got some snow-cover - resulting in the best possible conditions for Winter Kill. The tee-boxes and fairways have recovered 100%. The greens have been slower, but are improving daily.

Brent Robbie and Roger Pearson are looking after the golf course. The club house staff consists of Rhett Thomas, full-time; Annick Benningen and Anna Evans, part-time.

The dates for this season's golf tournaments are as follows:

Men's Open - July 27
Ladies Open - August 1
Juniors - August 8
60 Plus - September 10

Ken Rowson will be the Chairperson for the Men's; Rhett Thomas for the Ladies; Pat Hastings for the Juniors; and Bob Mansfield for the 60 Plus. Sign-up sheets will be available at the club house as follows:

Men's - June 30
Ladies - June 30
Juniors - July 10
60 Plus - August 1

Tradition prevails at Victoria Beach and children 12 years and under can play golf between 10 am and 2 pm on Tuesdays during July and August for \$1.00. The only restriction on children is they cannot tee off Saturdays, Sundays and holidays until after 10 am and must be accompanied by an adult. This is a condition of membership and also applies to green fee players. (For our purposes, an adult is 18 and over.)

During July and August, the golf course will open at 6:30 am. This should satisfy the early-birds and give the greenskeepers a chance to prepare the course for play. Play before 6:30 interferes with their work and is also confusing to the Clubhouse staff who control the order of play. They will not recognize second round privileges if you tee off before 6:30 am.

There is signage directing golfers from greens to tees and the paths must be followed for your safety.

I am asking the entire membership to support your golf course by speaking to any player not respecting the course; not repairing their ball marks; or not replacing their divots. Anything of a serious nature should be reported to the golf course staff. We also welcome constructive complaints, suggestions and compliments regarding improvements to and maintenance of the course.

A tee should be placed under the ball on all tee boxes to prevent divots. When needed, Tee Box Mix is supplied at all tee boxes to repair divots - please use it.

Council approved a major project to automate the existing irrigation system at a cost of \$75,000 to be paid for from the Golf Course Reserve and future revenue surpluses. In other words, at no cost to the Victoria Beach tax payers. By automating the system, we can regulate a more constant flow of water which will run in the off-usage hours (usually 10 pm to 6 am).

Now, we will be able to water the entire golf course at night, providing better playing conditions. The work was carried out by Ful-Flo Industries, who specialize in irrigation systems. They have done approximately 75 golf courses in the province. The system is low maintenance and should serve the golf course for the next 15 to 20 years.

The management and staff are committed to providing the best possible conditions for your golfing pleasure. Have a great season.
