No one wants to have to call for an ambulance or Fire units (and definitely no one wants a police car to come-a-knocking, but) in the unlikely event that you do require emergency service, it is definitely an asset for the crew to be able to quickly locate the house in order to provide the required assistance.

To obtain a civic address, attend to the Information Booth at the gate and fill in an application. The application itself is free, and \$20 gets you the green reflective number and an additional \$15.00 gets you a designer post to put the sign on. You have to sink it into the ground yourself. These numbers are made by Glenn Halgren and company.

#2 - Not everyone moves out of the way when an Emergency vehicle is fast approaching. Some people even stop an Emergency Vehicle with lights ablaze and sirens wailing just to ask what is happening! Tennis News



Our Tennis Committee has received positive feedback from many of the tennis players regarding last year's rule changes. This resulted in shorter waiting periods for courts and different players being on the courts each day.

This year, our committee has been asked to: consider the following changes by individual players . . . and to clarify our rules.

1) Q: Can we move the Teen Round Robin from Wednesday evening to Tuesday evening?

A: Our committee thinks this is a great idea and hopes to implement for 2004.

2) Q: Can we increase singles time from 30 to 45 minutes and doubles time from 45 to 60 minutes?

A: With over 1,000 tennis members and long waiting periods on weekends, our mandate is to try to get many different players on the courts and to shorten waiting periods. As a result, we believe that the majority of tennis players would prefer to leave the time periods as they are.

3) Q: If a doubles group shows up to play and is missing one player (i.e. one player doesn't show up), can we let another player (just coming off the courts) fill in for the missing player? In this situation, the courts are full and there are people waiting.

A: The request is to circumvent the present rule whereby a player cannot be on the waiting list while he/she is playing. The rule was implemented to allow many different players to play, as opposed to the same players continuing to play at the expense of players who have not yet played. If a group makes arrangements to play doubles and one player does not show up, the responsibility lies with the player who didn't show up. The responsibility doesn't belong to the Club to circumvent the rules (at the expense of other players) to compensate for the no-show player.

4) Q: If there is a waiting period for the courts and a player leaves the court area and is not there when their turn comes up, what happens?

A: If you are waiting for a court, and you leave — planning to come back when your name is called, the tennis court attendant (if requested) will advise you where you are on the waiting list. It is each player's responsibility to ensure that he/she is at the tennis courts when his/her name is called. If a name is called and no one from that player's group is present to advise the court attendant, the group name will be deleted, and the next group name will be called.

5) Q: If there is a waiting list, do waiting players have to stay at the tennis courts?

A: The important thing is that the players are at the courts when their name is called and a court is available to them. Players are not required to stay at the tennis courts to wait for a court. Court attendants will no longer do the equivalent of ball checks (i.e. calling out players' names on the waiting list to ensure that they are there). We've implemented this positive change.

6) Q: If the courts are full and there is a waiting list, at what point can a player's name be added to the waiting list? (i.e. If the first player of a doubles group arrives at the court can he sign in for the group?)

A: All players of the group (i.e. 2 for singles, 4 for doubles) must be present before their name is added to the waiting list. This is the point at which the court attendant verifies that all players have shoe tags or guest passes. This is also the point where the court attendant sells shoe tags or guest passes to those who do not have them. In order for the court attendant to do this, all players must be present.

7) Q: What happens if the court attendant calls out the group's name from the waiting list, but not all the players are present (but, at least one player is)?

A: The court attendant assigns the court and marks down the time. Whether one or three players are present, the time allotment is 30 minutes. If the 4th player arrives late for doubles, the time allotment is extended to 45 minutes.



Mrs. David sold all the groceries one would need - cheese, fruit, meat, etc. as well as everything from coal-oil lamps to yard goods. The children were happy to choose penny candy. Every year Mrs. David collected skating equipment for the winter residents. Her store was the center of the community.

For 45 years, **Mrs. Morton** has resided in her cottage "Redwing". From 1972 to 1992 she and **Joe** stayed the winter. They both enjoyed skiing and snowshoeing. Senior Tennis Tournament August 2 - 4

Manitoba's biggest tennis tournament once again takes center court, and the remaining five for that matter, on the August Long Weekend.

Sign-up sheets, which have already been posted at the courts, will be removed at the entry deadline of Wednesday at noon. The draw will be posted by Friday at noon with the first matches scheduled for 8 a.m. on Saturday.

A tournament of this size requires an absolute minimum of empty courts so we will once again use the "Next on" scheduling method. That is, the first six matches of the day will be the only ones with a time. The players in match No. 7 must be ready to go when the first match is completed (if there's a no-show for one of the first six matches, No. 7 will go on after the match has been defaulted at 8:15). Then, the players in match No. 8 must be ready for the following open court . . . and so on.

We will use qualifying events in the men's singles and doubles assuming this year's entries are at previous year's levels. We will also use no-ad scoring (sudden death at deuce, the receiver chooses the side) for at least Saturday's play.

In an attempt to finish up earlier in the day on Monday, we will also be playing a round or two later in the day on both Saturday and Sunday.

Participants will be allowed to play in a maximum of three events and must pay their \$5 entry fee per event prior to their first match. Yes, this is a \$1 hike from last year but for comparison purposes, three events at the Manitoba Open costs \$50 and there isn't a bakery within 10 miles.

We will strictly enforce the 15-minute default rule and the court attendants will time every match's warmup to ensure they don't exceed five minutes. [Sorry to sound like the fun police, but until the Rhinoceros Party unseats the NDP and makes this a six-day weekend, our hands are tied.]

To be eligible, players must have turned 18 years old by Dec. 31, 2002 and be members of the VB Club. We will once again grant wild card entries to the junior tennis tournament winners in their respective events.

In the event of any disputes, we will refer to Tennis Canada's rule book, "The Yardstick." Anybody willing to volunteer to put matches on court and record scores can sign up at the courts and any kids who would like to be ball boys and girls for the finals, please let us know.

Would last year's winners please bring the trophies to the courts on the Saturday morning? And please don't forget the name plate marking your win list.

LAKE WINNIPEG WATER LEVEL INFORMATION


July 2003

The following information is provided by the Water Resources Branch, Province of Manitoba, and published by Manitoba Hydro as a courtesy to those interested in the outlook for water levels on the lake.

LAKE WINNIPEG LEVEL FORECAST

The water level forecast below shows the history of water levels on Lake Winnipeg for the past two years, the monthly extremes that have occurred since 1913, and a range of future water levels for the next three months. The forecast shown "BEST ESTIMATE" will occur if present inflow trends continue. The remaining two forecasts show the range of possible levels given extreme wet or dry conditions. Of course, the lake's level may go up or down, depending on the precipitation.

LAKE WINNIPEG REGULATION

The outflow of Lake Winnipeg is regulated by Manitoba Hydro by a control structure at Jenpeg Generating Station on the Nelson River near the outlet of the lake. While the wind eliminated level of Lake Winnipeg is between 711 and 715 feet, Manitoba Hydro regulates the outflows from the lake as required for power production purposes. During periods when the wind eliminated water level is above 715 feet, Manitoba Hydro must operate the control structure at Jenpeg in such a manner to effect maximum outflow possible under the circumstances then prevailing until the water level of Lake Winnipeg recedes to 715 feet. During periods when the water level is below 711 feet, Manitoba Hydro must operate the control structure at Jenpeg as ordered by the Minister of Conservation. In addition to the control structure at Jenpeg, the Lake Winnipeg Regulation project included the removal of restrictions in existing channels and the excavation of new channels to improve outflow capacity from the lake. This work increased the maximum outflow capacity of the lake by up to 50 per cent, meaning that in high water periods or high electricity demand periods, more water can be passed out of the lake more quickly than prior to Lake Winnipeg Regulation. Therefore, extended high water periods and flooding around the lake are significantly reduced.
