VB Bike Race - Sunday, August 1

The great VB Bike Race will be held Sunday, August 1st. The start signal will be at 10 am, registration will be 9:30-10 am at the Sports Ground. Please bring your membership card or a \$1.00 entry fee.

Each age group will use a slightly different route:
- 7 and under: Will travel from the Sports Ground up First to Arthur, along Arthur to Eighth to Gibson and across the Sports Ground.

- 8-12: Will travel up First to King Edward, along King Edward to Eighth, along Eighth to Gibson and across the Sports Ground. Ages 8-10 will be separated from ages 11-12.

- 13-18: Will travel the "long course" along First to Eighth to Gibson and across the Sports Ground.

Medals will be awarded to the first male and female in each of the four age categories, ribbons for second and third. Anyone wishing to compete for the trophy must ride the long course and pass the checkpoint at 8th and 1st.

Multi-gear bikes will be taped to one gear to ensure even competition against beach bikes. Contestants and parents are responsible for making sure brakes are in good working order. Cyclists should be careful when turning corners at King Edward from 1st and at Gibson from 8th.

We need a few parents to help with registration and to help direct cyclists at the corners. If you can help, please let me know during registration. If you think you can keep up with your budding Olympic cyclist, feel free to ride along with them. Bicycle helmets are strongly recommended. Please wear yours.

A "BIRD'S EYE VIEW" of Victoria Beach for only \$50!

With a little help from friends, a unique aerial view of Victoria Beach from 8th Avenue to the lake on the North, South and West boundaries has been created. And it can be yours!

Using aerial photos from a 1998 Manitoba Hydro mapping project, an Orthophoto has been produced of the area described above. An Orthophoto is simply a mosaic of aerial photos combined with the latest digital technology to produce a scaled, accurate photo of an area. As an added bonus, a current compiled plan using all the legal survey plans available since 1914 will be included with each Orthophoto.

Shaun Dennehy, a surveyor for over 30 years has initiated and managed this project, ably assisted by Trish Rathwell and Melanie Tooley, as a legacy and for the benefit of the Beach community. This unique project is dedicated to all V.B. volunteers, past and present, which have helped to make the Beach such a wonderful summer retreat. Shaun would especially like to dedicate this effort to his mom, Dodie Dennehy, who has given much time and energy over the years serving as a RMVB Councillor, a Bridge Convenor and President of the V.B. Community Club.

This makes a great gift! What an interesting addition this will be to your cottage or home! Best of all, all profits will go to the Community Club whose outstanding efforts benefit the entire community.

Junior Achievement News



Two years ago, the VB Board created a 7-step plan to improve safety at the dances and address these community concerns. These issues continued to plague our beach and have, in fact, escalated.

The Annual General Meeting of the VB Club is scheduled for Saturday, August 21 at 10:00 a.m. at the Clubhouse. This issue will be discussed then, and we welcome one and all.

In the interim, the VB Board voted to cancel this year's August Adult Dance scheduled for Saturday, July 31.

Policeman's Corner

"Value - Cherish - Protect"

I read a quote recently in a magazine and found myself thinking of Victoria Beach: "People who know the value of something are inclined to cherish and protect it".

We have a way of life here at Victoria Beach that is enviable, and those of us who realize that want to retain it. Take the Adult Dance situation as an example. When asked how the July 17th dance went, my response was that it went without incident, but it was a powder keg. My observations are as follows:

■ The event is supposed to be for 250 people. There were more like 350 there.

■ Many of those people are from far away and don't care about this place. They cause damage, mischief, noise, and theft during the course of the night.

■ Minors congregate at the periphery of this event, and are given beer by older participants. [We had an overdose call regarding a 15-year-old girl at 6:30 am on the morning after. VB First Responders and Pine Falls Ambulance were called.]

■ At the end of the night, the floor is soaked with beer and sand, the walls are covered with ketchup and salami, and the toilets are plugged with buns. The only thing missing is Nick Hill saying "come on down", we have "wholesale madness" down here. Many partiers pour beer over their heads (and the heads of others), much to the delight of some (and the chagrin of others). The band had been here before, and wisely covered their speakers with plastic.

■ The streets are beginning to look like a beer garden, and what I am trying to achieve is somewhere between a "police state" and "anything goes". If people are not willing to police themselves, then we begin to lean closer to the "police state".

■ We have a need for increased security at the VB Parking Lot, as inebriated people wander and gather there. We have had vehicles kicked, dented, and otherwise damaged. That same night, there was an incident at the Parking Lot where a person was attempting to steal a bicycle and when stopped by one of the cab drivers, threats were uttered and it was fortunate that the VB Police just happened to drive into the lot. The wholesale theft of bicycles has become a given, unfortunately.

■ One of the Police officers was walking the beach and someone, under the cloak of darkness and not realizing who he was speaking to, offered the officer some "shrooms".

Council Corner

It has come to our attention that some property owners may be renting their Detached Sleeping Quarters, as a separate unit from their main dwelling. It is illegal, under the provisions of the Victoria Beach Planning Scheme, to rent a Detached Sleeping Quarters independent of the main dwelling.

Detached Sleeping Quarters was included as a "permitted use" under an amendment to the Victoria Beach Planning Scheme in 1994. Prior to this amendment, the Municipality allowed construction of secondary dwellings under "Accessory Buildings". Restrictions regarding the use of Detached Sleeping Quarters were imposed as a result of the many concerns received at the Public Hearing (in 1994) that this secondary dwelling might be used a rental property rather than additional accommodation for family members.

We note that the use of Detached Sleeping Quarters is identified as being secondary and incidental to the Main Dwelling in all of the Districts zoned "residential".

In addition, the definitions section of the Victoria Beach Planning Scheme contains the following:

B.17.1 Detached Sleeping Quarters:

A secondary detached dwelling located on the same site as the cottage dwelling which:

(a) is intended to be used as an extension to the seasonal residential use of the cottage dwelling;

(b) provides secondary and incidental accommodation for family members and guests of the occupants of the cottage dwelling; and

(c) is not intended for exclusive occupancy by a family living independent from the occupants of the cottage dwelling. If rented, both the cottage dwelling and detached sleeping quarters are to be considered as a single unit. Detached sleeping quarters are not to be rented separately from the cottage dwelling. A guest cottage is not to contain cooking facilities and is not serviced by public utilities independent of the cottage dwelling.

Under The Planning Act, any person who contravenes any provision of the Planning Scheme is guilty of an offence and liable, on summary conviction, to a fine not exceeding \$1,000 or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding six months or to both.

We respectfully request that any taxpayers who are renting their Detached Sleeping Quarters discontinue this practice immediately.


LAKE WINNIPEG WATER LEVEL INFORMATION

July 2004

The following information is provided by the Water Resources Branch, Province of Manitoba, and published by Manitoba Hydro as a courtesy to those interested in the outlook for water levels on the lake.

LAKE WINNIPEG LEVEL FORECAST

On July 15, the wind eliminated level of Lake Winnipeg was 714.8 feet and rising very slowly. The water level forecast below shows the history of water levels on Lake Winnipeg for the past two years, the monthly extremes that have occurred since 1913, and a range of future water levels for the next three months. The forecast shown "BEST ESTIMATE" will occur if present inflow trends continue. The remaining two forecasts show the range of possible levels given extreme wet or dry conditions. The lake's level is expected to peak in late July and then to decline during the following month. Of course, the lake's level may go up or down, depending on the precipitation.



LAKE WINNIPEG REGULATION

The outflow of Lake Winnipeg is regulated by Manitoba Hydro by a control structure at Jenpeg Generating Station on the Nelson River near the outlet of the lake. While the wind eliminated level of Lake Winnipeg is between 711 and 715 feet, Manitoba Hydro regulates the outflows from the lake as required for power production purposes. During periods when the wind eliminated water level is above 715 feet, Manitoba Hydro must operate the control structure at Jenpeg in such a manner to effect maximum outflow possible under the circumstances then prevailing until the water level of Lake Winnipeg recedes to 715 feet. During periods when the water level is below 711 feet, Manitoba Hydro must operate the control structure at Jenpeg as ordered by the Minister of Conservation. In addition to the control structure at Jenpeg, the Lake Winnipeg Regulation project included the removal of restrictions in existing channels and the excavation of new channels to improve outflow capacity from the lake. This work increased the maximum outflow capacity of the lake by up to 50 per cent, meaning that in high water periods or high electricity demand periods, more water can be passed out of the lake more quickly than prior to Lake Winnipeg Regulation. Therefore, extended high water periods and flooding around the lake are significantly reduced.
