summer. In spite of having been pretty sick this spring Bruce is busy keeping our facilities functioning again this year.

One of the most difficult tasks in which I participated this year was the selection of our Recreation, Tennis, and Library staff. From my experience initiating and running the Teen Program for six summers, I know that we have many wonderful teenagers at our beach. However, this was really made clear when we had to fill 18 positions from 38 good applicants. Our apologies to those who were not successful in being hired this summer. We sincerely hope that you have found other employment and that, if you are still interested, you will apply to the Club again next year. Names of club employees can be found on the Events Calendar you will receive when you purchase your membership. Speaking of which, our canvassers will be out next weekend selling memberships and accepting donations. Be sure to purchase a membership and use your wristband at all club activities. Remember, a family membership means 2 parents or guardians and their immediate family!

We are installing a "mailbox" in the Clubhouse for those of you who wish to communicate with us about various activities, problems, complaints, and kudos. It is intended mainly for communications about the clubhouse facility, but feel free to use it to communicate on other Club issues as well. It will be checked on a regular basis by our Vice President, Kelly Garagan.

There is another change that I want to address in this rather lengthy "message". In an effort to show leadership in the area of reducing the number of vehicles that are allowed into the restricted area with special passes for special activities, the club has agreed to set an example by asking all events convenors who must use a vehicle in order to prepare for their event to use a taxi for this purpose rather than ask for a permit to drive past the gate. Again, we are trying to do our part to reduce the frequency of that most common complaint at VB: "where are all these cars coming from?" If we all do our part in not asking for exceptions to the rule, we can go a long way towards maintaining the beloved unique character of our beach.

Our club has a major expense ahead of us involving replacement of the roof of the Clubhouse. This roof has been patched and repaired countless times but continues to leak regularly. We have received estimates on the cost of its repair in the range of \$26,000 and up! Naturally this is a huge chunk of our capital. If you were considering a charitable donation to the Victoria Beach Community Club, this would be a great time to act on that thought! This can be done when you are approached during the membership drive, or at any other time by contacting me, our treasurer Tim Walker, or any other member of the board. All donations will receive a receipt for income tax purposes.

Thanks in advance for your patience with the Club in this period of transition in board members and employees. We have a great volunteer executive and I expect that there will be some little bumps in the road, but I anticipate that they will be few and dealt with promptly and efficiently. I am looking forward to meeting even more VBers this summer. If the adults are half as much fun as the VB teenagers, this is going to be great!

Golf Course News

Once again I would like to welcome back all our golfers for another golf season.

The course opened on April 30th [to 3 inches of snow!]. We started work on April 18th, with very little snow around. The tee boxes, fairways and greens did not winter well, but have improved considerably since April.

This year, the golf course will be looked after by **Roger Pearson** and **Mel Rawluk** (full-time) and **Jonathan Willoughby** (part-time). The clubhouse staff consists of **Reth Thomas** (full-time) along with **John Forrest** and **Anna Evans** (part-time).

The dates for the summer's golf tournaments are as follows:

Men's Open - July 22 [Tee-offs at 8 a.m. and 1:30 p.m.]

Ladies Open - July 27 [Tee-offs at 8 a.m. and 11 a.m.]

Ken Rowson will once again be the chairperson for the Men's; **Sherrill Zellis** for the Ladies; **Pat Hastings** for the Junior's; **Barb Sudermann** and **Nick Beaton** for the 60 +.

The future of golf is with the children, and on Tuesdays during July and August, they can play for \$1.00 between 10 a.m. and 2 p.m. Parents - don't send your children to the golf course - bring them!

The only restriction on children is that they cannot tee off Saturday, Sundays, and Holidays until after 10:00 a.m., and must be accompanied by an adult. This is a condition of membership, and also applies to green-fee players. (For golf course purposes, an adult is 18 or over).

I am of the view that the entire membership should marshal the golf course by speaking to those who are not respecting the course; not repairing their ball marks; or not replacing their divots. Anything of a serious nature should be reported to the golf course staff. We also welcome constructive complaints, suggestions, and compliments regarding VB golf course improvements and maintenance.

A tee should be placed under the ball on all tee boxes to prevent divots. When needed, Tee-Box-Mix is supplied at all tees to repair divots - please use it. There is signage directing golfers from greens to tees, and the paths must be followed for your safety.

The golf course will open daily at 7:00 a.m. giving greenskeepers a chance to prepare the course for play. Play before opening interferes with their work, and is also confusing to the Clubhouse Staff, who control the order of play. 



2005 Tennis Lessons!

Council Corner

■ VICTORIA BEACH WATER SUPPLY SYSTEM

The Victoria Beach Water Treatment Plant was completely destroyed by fire on April 28, 2005. The Fire Commissioner has determined that the fire was caused by an electrical panel malfunction.

An interim water supply system has been put in place to provide non-potable water to customers of the Victoria Beach water system. The water being distributed to homes and cottages in the service area is Lake Winnipeg water that is chlorinated. Manitoba Health has issued a Boil Water Advisory because the water is non-potable and this Advisory will remain in effect until a new water treatment plant is built and distributing potable water. The Boil Advisory was distributed door-to-door to water customer's beach addresses in mid-May before water was supplied to the dwellings.

A new plant will not be constructed until 2006 at the earliest and depending on timelines relative to design, hearing(s), government approvals, financing, etc... the treatment plant may not be built before the 2007 season.

Council is requesting every property owner's cooperation in observing this Boil Advisory and ensuring that family members, visitors, renters, etc. are aware of the requirement to boil water before consumption.

The Municipality has the authority under By-Law No. 1198 to restrict water usage and council is requesting that all customers conserve water. Lawn watering is to be kept to a minimum and limited as follows: odd-numbered addresses on odd days of the month and even-numbered addresses on even days of the month. Our municipal police will be instructed to warn those who violate this water conservation measure and, if necessary, to issue fines to repeat offenders.

The Municipality has entered into an agreement with the Manitoba Model Forest to conduct an inventory and assessment of all properties within the Municipality relative to fire safety. The Model Forest is providing a software program designed to manage the information collected in a manner that will make it a very valuable tool for fire-prevention, fire-fighting, planning, etc. at no cost to the Municipality. Our employees will be examining each property in the Municipality to collect various data to input into a municipal computer. Property owners will be notified if there are fire prevention measures to be addressed relative to their properties following completion of the project. Please note that it may take more than one year to complete the collection of the data for all the properties. Council requests the cooperation of all property owners in permitting our staff access to their properties to enable the collection of information.

Swim Program 2005

Welcome VB'ers to Swim Safe 2005!

Your team this year is myself, Alice Russell - Swim Program Convenor, Andrea Karr, Swim Program Supervisor, Ian Burr, Laura Johnson and Emily Blirley - Instructors. The Victoria Beach Club is an affiliate member of the Red Cross and the Lifesaving Society. All instructors are employed by The Victoria Beach Club and hold valid Red Cross and Lifesaving Society certification.

Swim lessons will start on Monday, July 4th. Registration Day will take place on Sunday, July 3rd, from 1:00-3:00 p.m., at the Clubhouse. As usual, all registration will be first-come, first-served. Payment is due upon registration. Please also note that people in default of payment from last year will not be allowed to register this year until their account is cleared by cash payment. The fees and session dates for the 2005 season are:

Red Cross Swim Kids (Formerly Aquaquest) levels 1 - 10: two three-week sessions at a fee of \$15.00 per session. Lessons are 1/2 hour. Students may be registered for both sessions on registration day. Aqualeaders: two three-week sessions. 1 hour per day, at a fee of \$65.00 per session. Session dates are:

Session 1:

July 4 - July 22

Session 2:

July 25 - Aug 12

Private and semi-private lessons for Red Cross Swim Kids levels 1 - 10 will also be available upon request, time permitting. Lessons are 1/2 hour. The fee for private lessons is \$50.00 per week and for semi-private lessons (maximum two students at the same level), \$35.00 per week. We will make every effort to accommodate your request.

Lifesaving Society programs will also be offered: Swim Patrol (Rookie/Ranger/Star), Bronze Star, Bronze Medallion and Bronze Cross, in one six week session from July 4 - Aug. 12. Lesson length varies from 1/2 to 1 hour depending on the course. The fees are as follows: Swim Patrol- \$35.00; Bronze Star - \$50.00; Bronze Medallion/Bronze Cross- \$80.00. Bronze-level lifesaving classes may have additional fees of between \$10 and \$45-50, depending on level and need for textbooks. These will be paid directly to instructors when due.

All swimmers must be at least three years old when they start attending classes. No exceptions will be made. Red Cross Swim Preschool (Formerly Aquatots) classes for younger children and their parent/caregiver will be scheduled if there is enough interest shown on Registration Day.

In an effort to reduce the chaos of Registration Day, PLEASE note the following procedure:

BRING/KNOW:

- YOUR copy of VB Club membership form (memberships available on-site)

-****medical insurance #'s for each registrant

-cash or chequebook

-relevant medical conditions of each registrant (asthma, allergies, etc.)

-expected date of arrival/departure (see below)

-your own pen (highly recommended)

STEP ONE/AREA ONE - Choose Your Classes

-pick up a registration form and a swim program policy statement from the first table as you enter

-Check out the big program schedule poster to find your preferred classes

-Fill in your registration form; read the policy document

STEP TWO/TABLE TWO - Buy a Membership, if you haven't already got one.

STEP THREE/TABLE THREE - Get Signed Up/Fees Calculated

-There will be four lines at this area, each ending in one of the four instructors, who will assign students to classes. Any instructor can register you for all classes. Just pick the shortest line (!)

STEP FOUR/TABLE FOUR - Pay

-Payment is by cash or cheque (payable to Victoria Beach Club).

-Please use line-up time to have your cheques ready, if possible.

As usual, we will do our best to have the various amenities well labeled, but we rely on our experienced VB'ers to help anyone looking overwhelmed. Thank you in advance.

Again, we are asking you to "know" your expected date of departure. Too often we have found that suddenly a child will greet the instructor with "This is my last day today." Of course, the instructor, not having known this, has not prepared a progress report, and cannot stop to do so now. The child is disappointed. We hope that asking for this date in advance will minimize the problem. The date is not intended to be binding. You are free to change your mind, though we will still require two or three days notice if you decide to leave earlier than your stated date. As well, if you decide to stay longer, some notice would be appreciated as it will prevent the wasted time and expense of preparing documents prematurely.

If you cannot attend Registration Day Andrea will be at the Swim Dock every weekday morning from 9:30 to 10:00 a.m. to take new registrations (She will be at the Clubhouse if it is raining). The above fees apply. The base rate for Red Cross Swim Kids is \$15.00 for three weeks or any part thereof. Please be prompt. She cannot go beyond the time. As well, please ensure that you have YOUR copy of the VB Club membership form and medical insurance numbers and either cash or cheque payment.
