

Each age group will use a slightly different route:

- 7 and under: Will travel from the Sports Ground up First to Arthur, along Arthur to Eighth to Gibson and across the Sports Ground.

- 8-12: Will travel up First to King Edward, along King Edward to Eighth, along Eighth to Gibson and across the Sports Ground. Ages 8-10 will be separated from ages 11-12.

For both these events cars can be driven to the Church. Please stop and report at the gate.


