VB Cottage Owners Association Annual Meeting August, 2005 - Highlights

■ Present -

- Bob Johnson, President
- Ross Yarnell, Secretary
- 87 Cottage Owners

■ New Business

- Discussion regarding potential change regarding accumulation and disposal of brush on Municipal property. The Association was advised that as a result of significant abuse related to the accumulation (and content) of brush on Municipal property, the risk of fire and the fact that the existing dumping ground ("Y" of the railway line), changes will have to be made to the brush removal policy. Various cottagers commented upon possible solutions including a public chipper and stricter enforcement of existing rules. This appears to be a critical issue and needs Victoria Beach Council attention.

- A question was raised regarding the shortage of bicycle racks at the parking lot. Councillors Farrell and Morrison (in attendance at meeting) gave their assurance that this would be rectified for 2006.

- It was noted that while parties for bonfires on the beach had generally decreased, there were regular fires and parties at Clubhouse Beach. This is obviously a concern for cottage owners in this area.

- Rae Donovan commented that a doctor had not been available during the latter part of August. Councillor Morrison advised that he had been authorized by Council to review this matter. This is a critical issue that needs to be resolved for the 2006 season.

[It was moved by Rae Donovan and seconded by Elsie Hughes that the Association recommend to Council that contractual arrangements be made to ensure the availability of a medical doctor at Victoria Beach until the end of August.]

■ General Matters

- Need for additional benches in front of bakery;
- Fixing of major rut in front of library;
- Comment re: excessive speed of taxis (and sometimes bicycles) and that this needs to be reviewed by Council to ensure safety within the restricted area.
- Councillor Farrell reported on the status of the water treatment project and committed to keeping all cottage owners abreast of emerging issues.

- A lot of discussion took place regarding the excessive amount of traffic within the restricted area during July and August. Ab Hansford made a presentation to the meeting indicating that a petition had been presented to the August Council meeting. The Chief of Police, Stewart McPherson, commented that all vehicular traffic within the restricted area had appropriate passes (234 temporary passes were issued).

- There was also discussion regarding the extent of traffic on Pine (instead of the truck route). Councillor Morrison advised that he had been appointed by Council to review entry to the restricted area to make sure it was functional. It was also suggested that permits be allowed only during pre-set restricted hours. This issue is a major concern of the cottage owners and it was suggested that the Association form a task force to work with Council to better control traffic in the restricted area. [The President of the V.B.C.O.A. will endeavour to implement this action in 2006].

Following the meeting, there was a presentation from the Provincial Dept. of Natural Resources regarding the increased concern over Bear issues and possible remedies.

The Victoria Beach Club, an organization of volunteers, sponsors many of the recreational programs and events held during the summer. Wristbands are back again this year in a purple colour. Please remember that you **MUST** wear your wristband to all VB Club activities in order to participate in any club event. Each family member will receive a wristband upon the purchase of a membership. Parents—it would be a good idea to write your child's name on the wristband in the event that it gets lost. Replacements for lost wristbands are available for \$2.00. Wristbands will be checked at events.

If you miss the membership drive you can buy your membership during the swimming lesson registration on Sunday, July 2nd at the clubhouse, or throughout the summer at the Library (during regular hours) and the Tennis Courts.

Welcome VB'ers to Swim Safe 2006!

Your team this year is myself, Alice Russell - Swim Program Convenor; Emily Birley, Swim Program Supervisor; Lauren Johnson, Lisa Spangelo and Patrick Bech - Instructors. The Victoria Beach Club is an affiliate member of the Red Cross and the Lifeguarding Society. All instructors are employed by The Victoria Beach Club and hold valid Red Cross and Lifeguarding Society certification.

You executive is proud to continue its support of this longstanding, proud and vital VB tradition. At the root of our swim program is the desire to keep our families safe.

"Fun, Family and freedom" are words we often associate with the cottage. But living without a care in the world could, in fact, prove deadly. Water is a silent killer. Drownings are the third leading cause of preventable death for children under 10 years of age. They can happen in less than a minute and in just centimetres of water. [Source: Lifeguarding Society website]

As I was reading my June 2006 edition of Today's Parent, the article, "Why Children Drown" really hit home with me both as a mum, and as our swim convenor. The author of the article, John Hoffmann, references a study by the U.S-based National Safe Kids Campaign which found that 83 percent of children who drowned were being supervised by an adult at the time! Four key supervision pitfalls were found.

- **Distraction:** Parents admitted to doing other things while supervising swimming children: talking to other adults, supervising other kids, reading, eating, etc.

- **False security in numbers:** When there are many adults around, people often wrongly assume that someone else is watching the kids.

- **Distance:** Water safety experts say that young swimmers should always be within arm's reach, even in shallow water. When toddlers fall face forward in waist-deep water, their feet go up and their head goes down. They are heavier on the upper part of their bodies and therefore may not be able to right themselves.

- **Silence:** Many of us have a cartoon image of a drowning victim - thrashing, head up, calling for help. In reality, drowning is usually silent because the victim is unable to call for help.

Deadly serious? Yes. What can you do? Well, you may be interested in enrolling your family members in our swim program this summer. Here's what you need to know:

Swim lessons will start on Monday, July 3rd Registration Day will be on Sunday, July 2nd, from 1:00-3:00 p.m., at the Clubhouse. As usual, all registration will be first-come, first-served. Payment is due upon registration. Please also note that people in default of payment from last year will not be allowed to register this year until their account is cleared by cash payment. The fees and session dates for the 2006 season are:

Red Cross Swim Kids (Formerly Aquaquest) levels 1 - 10: two three-week sessions at a fee of \$15.00 per session. Lessons are 1/2 hour. Students may be registered for both sessions on registration day. AquaLeaders: two three-week sessions. 1 hour per day, at a fee of \$65.00 per session. Session dates are:

Session 1: July 3 - July 21 Session 2: July 24 - Aug 11

Private and semi-private lessons for Red Cross Swim Kids levels 1 - 10 will also be available upon request, time permitting. Lessons are 1/2 hour. The fee for private lessons is \$50.00 per week and for semi-private lessons (maximum two students at the same level), \$35.00 per week. We will make every effort to accommodate your request.

Lifeguarding Society programs will also be offered: Swim Patrol (Rookie/Ranger Star), Bronze Star, Bronze Medallion and Bronze Cross, in one six week session from July 3 - Aug 11. Lesson length varies from 1/2 to 1 hour depending on the course. The fees are as follows: Swim Patrol - \$35.00; Bronze Star - \$50.00; Bronze Medallion/Bronze Cross - \$80.00. Bronze-level lifesaving classes may have additional fees of between \$10 and \$50, depending on level and need for textbooks. These fees will be paid directly to instructors when due.

All swimmers must be at least three years old when they start attending classes. No exceptions will be made. Red Cross Swim

Preschool (Formerly Aquatots) classes for younger children and their parent/caregiver will be scheduled if there is enough interest shown on Registration Day.

There is a brand new swimming class called "Swim to Hillside" which will take place daily in the afternoon at the pier (time TBA on registration day).

Swimmers must be age 15 or older and know how to swim. Our lifeguards (at least two, depending on the number of registrants) will be present to supervise and offer stroke correction. Laps will be logged daily and the goal will be to swim the distance from VB to Hillside. Thanks to cottager Rudy Von Massow for initiating this special class!

In an effort to reduce the chaos of Registration Day, PLEASE note the following procedure:

- **BRING/KNOW:**

- YOUR copy of VB Club membership form (memberships available on-site)

- ****medical insurance #'s for each registrant

- cash or chequebook

- relevant medical conditions of each registrant (asthma, allergies, etc.)

- expected date of arrival/departure (see below)

- your own pen (highly recommended)

- **STEP ONE/AREA ONE - Choose Your Classes**

- pick up a registration form and a swim program policy statement from the first table as you enter.

- Check out the big program schedule poster to find your preferred classes.

- Fill in your registration form; read the policy document

- **STEP TWO/TABLE TWO - Buy a Membership, if you haven't already got one**

- **STEP THREE/TABLE THREE - Get Signed Up/Fees Calculated**

- There will be four lines at this area, each ending in one of the four instructors, who will assign students to classes. Any instructor can register you for any class. Just pick the shortest line.

- **STEP FOUR/TABLE FOUR - Pay**

- Payment is by cash or cheque (payable to Victoria Beach Club).
- Please use line-up time to have your cheques ready, if possible.

As usual, we will do our best to have the various areas/tables well labeled, but we rely on our experienced VB'ers to help anyone looking overwhelmed. Thank you in advance.

Again, we are asking you to "know" your expected date of departure. Too often we have found that suddenly, a child will greet the instructor with "This is my last day today." Of course, the instructor, not having known this, has not prepared a progress report, and cannot stop to do so now. The child is disappointed. We hope that asking for this date in advance will minimize the problem. The date is not intended to be binding. You are free to change your mind, though we will still require two or three days notice if you decide to leave earlier than your stated date. As well, if you decide to stay longer, some notice would be appreciated as it will prevent the wasted time and expense of preparing documents prematurely.

If you cannot attend Registration Day, Emily will be at the Swim Dock every weekday morning from 9:30 to 10:00 a.m. to take new registrations (She will be at the Clubhouse if it is raining). The above fees apply. The base rate for Red Cross Swim Kids is \$15.00 for three weeks or any part thereof. Please ensure that you have your copy of the VB Club membership form and medical insurance numbers and either cash or cheque payment.

Finally, a special thank you to Bruce Morrison for the new signage at the swim docks which clearly states that only instructors and swim students are allowed beyond the gate. This enables our instructors to remain focused on teaching their classes and keeping their students safe.

Looking forward to seeing you on Registration Day and wishing you a most enjoyable and safe summer!



■ Old hat

I know that I have written about this before but I think it deserves to be reiterated.

I realize and respect the fact that people come to the beach to get away from the cities that they hail from and all the worries therein but that does not mean that the laws change at Saffie Rd. Theft of bicycles, speeding, drinking in a public place, impaired driving . . . the laws are the same across the Province. The Victoria Beach Police DO show leniency and discretion and warnings ARE given out . . . but not all the time. We are in a "Catch-22" situation a lot of the time. If there is a complaint and we respond with discretion, the response is: "then what are we paying you for?" If we respond with an arrest or a ticket, we are viewed as being heavy handed and tactless.

Bottom Line- The laws are made by the politicians, the Police enforce them and the courts prosecute the offenders. If you don't want to be caught in the system, don't drink on the beach, don't steal a bike to ride home and don't drive impaired. If you get caught, expect the same as you would get in the city and if you get a break . . . great.

Be "Bear Smart"!

■ To be safe, avoid all contact with bears.

- Stay alert and be aware of your surroundings. Watch for bear signs: tracks, droppings, turned-up stumps, and claw marks in trees. If possible, keep in the open and avoid bear-activity areas, especially berry patches and carcass remains.

- Dogs can serve as an early-warning system for detecting the presence of bears, but should be kept on a leash at all times. A poorly trained dog may excite a bear, resulting in the bear following the dog back to its owner.

- Travel with a friend. Or tell someone where you will be.

- Never let children straggle behind or rush ahead.

- Make your presence known by any means available to you. Sight (waving your arms slowly) and/or sound (singing, clapping hands, talking in a calm voice) are good ways. Don't whistle, as it may resemble an animal's call.

- Do not use audio players with headsets, headphones or earbuds.

- Do not use cosmetics that emit strong fragrances.

- Avoid carrying and/or cooking highly odorous food (canned fish, bacon etc.).

- Do not feed birdseed or liquid sugar to birds from late April through October.

■ Black Bear Trivia:

The baby bear is called a cub; a female adult a sow, and an adult male a boar. At birth, a cub has no hair and weighs about 225 grams (8 oz. . . . about the size of a guinea pig.

The black bear can live up to 30 years or more.

The mother usually has one or two cubs though she may have up to 4.

The black bear is the smallest of North American bears.

They can be black, brown (auburn or cinnamon) or even white in colour. The black bear can run 48 kph (30 mph).

- Their habitat is mainly forest and brush areas all across North America.

- Their Size? A female adult weighs around 56-84 kg (125-250 lbs.) and an adult male about 69-181 kg (150-400 lbs.).

- Black bears are about 1.5m (5 ft.) in length

- The black bear is an OMNIVORE. It eats grass, nuts, berries, insects, grubs, fish and rodents.

■ Did you know?

- A bear has 42 teeth. Some teeth are sharp for tearing meat. Others are flat for chewing plants. Although bears are mammals that belong to the Carnivore order, their bodies have adapted over the years to allow them to feed well on vegetation. Bears began as small, quick carnivores but eventually became large-bodied omnivores. Polar bears are the exception to this. They continue to eat mainly meat.

- Newborn cubs are tiny - about the size of newborn kittens. The cubs are almost helpless. They can't see, hear, smell or walk. They have no teeth and almost no fur!

Long-time cottage owner, Lawrie Pollard, got together with a few summer friends and decided that the man many consider to be the father of Victoria Beach, Art Vincent, should be commemorated for his role in creating this idyllic community. They commissioned architect Dean Syverson to design a suitable memorial.

By the way, you'll find an item about the Vincent Memorial Shelter in the August 12, 2005 issue of the Herald, and we'll have more about the project when it's fully completed.
