## Long Weekend Lake Rescue at VB!

On August 6th, shortly after lunch time, our son Sean Woroniak and his fiance Sarah Lawrie were walking along the south end of Clubhouse Beach near the big rock when they encountered a young teenage girl waving her arms and screaming for help. After questioning the validity of her actions they realized that this was a serious situation. The young girl told them that her boyfriend and sister were in the lake and didn't know how to swim. The wind was very fierce, causing extremely high waves, and Sean could see the two people in distress were caught far from shore and were unable to get back. Both victims were out among the large rocks at the point. Sean proceeded to swim out into the water and rescue the girl first because she was closest to shore. The huge waves, rocky bottom and large rocks made it very difficult for Sean to keep his balance and get out to the exhausted teens. Once the girl was out of danger Sarah helped her onto shore. Sean then went back into the water to rescue the young male who by that time had been swept even further out and around the point. They were no longer in Sarah's view which caused her a high level of anxiety. Sean was able to reach and rescue the young male and pulled him to shore on the pier side of the point.

All were rescued without any serious harm. No one required medical care aside from several scratches and bruises on Sean's legs and feet caused by contact with the rocks. An observer then called the VB Police who attended and, later, so did the RCMP.

It is very probable these two totally exhausted teenagers would have drowned had it not been for the immediate action taken by Sean and Sarah. This would have been a tragic end to a day of "fun" in the big waves. This should be a lesson for all to be extremely careful when the waves are that high and especially to NEVER go near the rocks when waves are crashing against them.

It is fortunate these two young people have been given a second chance and, although it wasn't necessary and was perhaps lost in the emotional intensity of the circumstances, a simple thank-you was never mentioned by the victims themselves or by the elder that was present with them at the time. Sean and Sarah did get gratitude from the crowd that had gathered to watch what was happening and have the satisfaction of knowing they were successful in their attempts to help.

### Notice of Environment Act Proposal

Manitoba Conservation has received a proposal pursuant to The Environment Act from the following operation and invites public participation in the review process:

#### RURAL MUNICIPALITY OF VICTORIA BEACH WATER TREATMENT PLANT (File: 5104.00)

A Proposal has been filed by Stantec Consulting Ltd. on behalf of the Rural Municipality of Victoria Beach for the disposal of wastewater from a new water treatment plant at Victoria Beach. The proposed plant is a package installation that would provide flocculation and coagulation followed by chlorination and pH adjustment. The wastewater streams produced by the plant would include clarifier sludge, which would be settled and disposed of in an existing offsite wastewater treatment lagoon, filter backwash water, which would be settled and discharged to Lake Winnipeg, and filtered water produced immediately after filter backwashing, which would be discharged to Lake Winnipeg. Current demand for treated water is approximately 27 litres per second, and the plant would have a capacity of 40 litres per second, accommodating the anticipated demand in 20 years. Construction of the proposed plant is projected to be completed by May, 2007. Operation of the plant would occur from mid May to mid October each year.

Anyone likely to be affected by the above operation and who wishes to make a representation either for or against the proposal should contact the Department, in writing or by E-mail ([bwetbb@gov.mb.ca](mailto:bwetbb@gov.mb.ca)), not later than SEPTEMBER 5, 2006. Upon receipt of any notification, the Department may request a public hearing to be held and the concerned persons will be notified. Further information is available from the Public Registers located at 123 Main St. (Union Station) Main Floor, Winnipeg; the Winnipeg Public Library, 4<sup>th</sup> Floor, 251 Donald St., Winnipeg; the Manitoba Eco-Network, 3<sup>rd</sup> Floor, 383 Portage Ave., Winnipeg; and the Sellkirk & St. Andrews Regional Library, 383 Main St., Sellkirk; or by contacting Bruce Webb, Water Development & Control Assessment Officer at 945-7021.

Information submitted in response to this proposal is considered public information and will be made available to the proponent and placed on the public registry established in accordance with Section 17 of The Environment Act.



## Remember the Floatplanes at VB . . . and the Pinehurst Inn?



In this 1923 photo of float planes in the bay, the VB Pier is in the background. On the right is the end of 'Pier Point' . . . with two of the Pinehurst Inn cottages visible, and just to the right of those — part of the Inn itself.

In 1922, the Forest Conservation Service established a float-plane air-base at VB and built their hangar on top of an abandoned hotel foundation. The base was located at what is now the Sailing Club and the Sports field.

Then, in 1927, the air-base moved from Victoria Beach to the calmer waters of Lac du Bonnet. The wooden floor of the hangar became VB's first tennis court.

### More on the Pinehurst Inn . . .

It was built as a single log house in 1916; was later expanded [around 1924]; and eventually became the Victoria Beach Inn. [If you keep your old Heralds, you could refer to the August 6/1999 issue for a feature on the Inn.]

[Some of the buildings from the Pinehurst Inn complex still exist. The original 'Staff Building' is today the two-storey cottage on the south-east corner of Pine and Eighth — across from the Church.]

Thanks to Gerri Oakley of Center Avenue who sent along some other tidbits of 'Pinehurst' history. She refers to several "cottages" that were part of the Inn complex — and stretched down Pier Road. One of these is today's VB Library, and Gerri points out that two more of the original cottages are today located at 130 and 132 Center Avenue. "These two cottages were purchased in 1957, a few years after the VB Inn fire," says Gerri. "They were dismantled and moved to their present locations at that time."


