Council Corner

■ Illegal Dumping

Illegal dumping continues to be a serious problem despite our constant and numerous communications requesting that people refrain from dumping refuse on municipal land. At the July 17th meeting, council passed By-Law #1493 to improve the enforcement aspects of existing municipal by-laws relating to illegal dumping. The maximum fine that may be assessed by the Municipal Police, under this By-Law, is \$1,000 per occurrence. In addition, the By-Law provides "Where a contravention continues for more than one day, the person is guilty of a separate offence for each day it continues."

■ Tax & Water Payments

Property tax and water service charges are due July 31, 2007. A payment made on August 1st (or an envelope post-marked August 1st) is taken as late and will result in a penalty charge of 1.25%. It is a PENALTY NOT INTEREST and the rate charged is the same whether the payment is made on the 1st or 31st of August. Late payment charges bring out some rather interesting comments such as: (1) "You threw away my cheque", (2) "You didn't send me a 2nd notice", (3) "I never got a tax bill", (4) "That's stupid" (the penalty rate), (5) "You should send the tax bills by registered mail".

■ Volunteers

Beach Banter!

■ I find myself compelled today to respond to the Presidents Message of last week.

My concern lies in the proposal to extend the length of term for board positions to two years from the current one-year period.

I would start by saying that I am not necessarily against this idea. I can see the merit in Ms. Birley's statement that it could bring more "consistency". Moreover, it was the omission of a number of serious factors that gave me pause.

Last year's AGM was the most attended in recent history. While that can be regarded as a positive factor, the truth was a little more troubling. The board at that time found itself in the beginning of a legal controversy that is continuing to this day. While we were told that no discussion would take place on this matter it has the potential to affect our entire membership financially and the people should be aware of at least the costs concerned to date.

The President's message said that it was difficult to find volunteers to fill board positions. This is inaccurate. I would encourage any member to contact the board and request minutes from the last year's AGM. They would find that there were enough people who let their name stand to fill the board almost three times over.

The current board was duly elected and that is the way democracy is supposed to work. The bottom line however, is that they were elected to a one year mandate in a very close and hotly contested race.

I propose then, that in the interest of fairness, these two year terms (if adopted) commence after the elections at this year's AGM. I would also hope that in addition to the nominating committee, that the chair will continue to recognize nominations from the floor. This would eliminate any appearance that these positions are simply "handed down" to those like mind only.

I also would like to see in this forum, a disclosure of costs incurred on legal matters outstanding, as they affect all of us.

Clarity, I am sure you will agree, should be the cornerstone of the Victoria Beach Club. Clarity allows us, the membership to feel good about those we elect. Clarity is our demand.

VB Club President's response:

Mr. Cameron is correct that the new by-laws extend the term of office of the elected directors to two years from one. This will bring more consistency to the running of our Club as the active season is so short. However the Board has already appointed a nominating committee to elicit nominations for all elected directors positions at the Aug 25th AGM. Naturally there will also be the opportunity for nominations from the floor, as in previous years. (Please note that I clearly stated this in the President's Message in this Herald.)

It is also correct that last year's AGM was very well attended and yes, there was controversy that led to the large attendance. I have reviewed data over the past 15 years regarding attendance at our AGM's and availability of volunteers willing to stand for election to the Board. The truth of the matter is this: the median attendance at AGM's over the past 15 years was 18 members; the only occasion in the last 15 years upon which more than one member allowed his/her name to stand

for election to any given position was in 2006. Therefore I stand by my statement in last week's President's Message regarding the shortage of volunteers running for elected office. There have even been Herald articles pleading with the membership to step forward and stand for election!

With respect to any legal proceedings involving the Board, we received legal advice not to comment.

While last year's attendance was in fact NOT the highest in recent years, in the interests of the Victoria Beach community as a whole, it would be great to have at least that number of members on August 25th this year. I hope to see all of you there!

Policeman's Corner

■ Sir Robert Peel's Nine Points of Policing:

- 1- The basic mission for which the police exist is to prevent crime and disorder.
- 2- The ability of the police to perform their duties is dependent upon public approval of police actions.
- 3- Police must secure the willing co-operation of the public in voluntary observance of the law to be able to secure and maintain the respect of the public.
- 4- The degree of co-operation of the public that can be secured diminishes proportionately to the necessity of the use of physical force.
- 5- Police seek and preserve public favour not by catering to public opinion but by constantly demonstrating absolute impartial service to the law.
- 6- Police use physical force to the extent necessary to secure observance of the law or to restore order only when the exercise of persuasion, advice and warning is found to be insufficient.
- 7- Police, at all times, should maintain a relationship with the public that gives reality to the historic tradition that the police are the public and the public are the police; the police being only members of the public who are paid to give full-time attention to duties which are incumbent on every citizen in the interests of community welfare and existence.
- 8- Police should always direct their action strictly towards their functions and never appear to usurp the powers of the judiciary.
- 9- The test of police efficiency is the absence of crime and disorder, not the visible evidence of police action in dealing with it.

■ Policing is a noble profession and we are forced to deal with the worst society has to offer on a regular basis. Some examples of what we dealt with this week:

- shooting at the Grand Marais Hotel
- 911 shots fired call... luckily just target shooters.
- gang members wearing colours in the R.M.
- male arrested on Canada Wide warrant.
- VBP member assaulted, 9:45pm on the beach.

People sleep peacefully in their beds at night only because men and women of the Police are ready to do battle on their behalf.


